SECAUCUS, N.J. (AP) - Henry Krajewski, 54, founder of the Poor Man's party and a perennial candidate for state and national elections died on one of the rare elections days when he was not seeking office.

Krajewski, who ran for president three times, died Tuesday of a heart attack at his home here. He formed the Poor Man's party in 1949 and ran for president in 1952, 1956 and 1960.

CBC Reporting Seen As Danger

OTTAWA (CP) - Opposition Leader Diefenbaker says the CBC should be warned of inherent dangers in placing more emphasis on commentary in news reporting.

He also said in the Commons he wants to know the reason for the sudden "demotion" of Earl Cameron, who has been the mainstay of the CBC's 11 p.m. national news report for seven years.

State Secretary Judy LaMarsh, who reports to Parliament for the publicly-owned corporation, said she would ask about Mr. Cameron and would send copies of Hansard, the record of Commons debates, to CBC officials so they would be aware of Mr. Diefenbaker's views.

42 Whoopers Are Counted

WASHINGTON (AP) - Forty-two whooping cranes, including five young, have been counted at the Aransas National Wildlife Refuge on the Texas coast of the Gulf of Mexico, the U.S. interior department has announced.

When the rare whoopers began their northward migration last spring the wild flock numbered a record 44 birds. The count Monday showed a gain of six over a census conducted last week. Earl Denham, refuge foreman, said regular aerial surveys will be continued in the hope of finding that more of the rare birds have found their way to the refuge from the nesting grounds in Canada.
