

Only Minor Tariff Changes Are Announced in Budget

OTTAWA (CP)—Minor tariff changes—all reductions or extensions of free-entry provisions due to expire shortly—are contained in the budget. They took effect Wednesday.

Some medicines and materials for religious or educational institutions and societies have been exempted from duty.

Free entry also is extended for assorted farm machinery, aircraft and engines not made in Canada and a chemical for fighting forest fires.

N.S. Adjusts Speed Limits

HALIFAX (CP)—Highways Minister Smith has indicated which Nova Scotia roads will have an increased speed limit of 65 miles an hour.

Speaking in the legislature on amendments to the Motor Vehicle Act, Mr. Smith said stretches of the Trans-Canada Highway in the Westworth Valley and between Port Hastings and Baddeck in Cape Breton, as well as the Halifax Bicentennial Drive, will be among the first to have the new limit.

He also said traffic on these roads would be subject to a minimum limit of possibly 45 miles an hour. The minimum on other trunk roads would be 40 miles an hour, although no firm decision on these figures had been reached.

The amendment, given second reading, would allow the highways minister to raise the speed limit to 65 miles an hour from 60 at his discretion, and to post minimum limits to be established at his discretion.

Mr. Smith said it was reasonable to expect the limit can be increased on first class roads. On the same roads, other drivers were as much a menace as fast drivers.

Big Pond or Priest Pond.
Bedeque:—Route No. 1A The Dunk River. It can be fished from a number of vantage points. Ask for information at the general store at Ross's Corner, Bedeque. When the sea trout are running, it is one of the best streams on the island.
Bonshaw:—Route No. 1 The West River (at various places); Crosby's Mill; Riverdale; Desable; Dixon's Mill.
Crapaud:—Route No. 1 McLeod's (Crapaud Village) Lord's (North Tryon).
Albany:—Route No. 1 Mid-dleton.
Flat River:—Route No. 1 Flat River Bridge (via Vernon River Bridge); Hughie McPherson's Mill.
Vernon River:—Route No. 1 Ross Mills; Vernon River Stream; Vernon River Causeway; Melish Pond (beyond New Perth).
Montague:—Route No. 3 Electric Light and Power Dam; Montague; The Montague River; The Old Power Dam; Montague; MacRae's Mills and Stream (Hesherdale); Sturgeon Bridge; Harvey Moore's Sanctuary.
Cardigan:—Route No. 2 Seal River; Mitchell River; The Cardigan River (both sides including Morrison's Beach, McAnis's Wilson's Point, etc.)
Murray River:—Route No. 4 Filling's or Leco's Mills; (McLure's Mills (boat available here). See Vance Strickland.
Bell River:—Route No. 4 ask at Compton's Store and inquire about fishing conditions. Belle River can be fished from several spots along the River Bank. Compton's By-Pass Pond at head of Belle River has boats for hire. Good sea trout fishing.
Bridgetown:—Route No. 5 Fishing is good off Bridge and at Herb MacLeod's farther down the river.
Annapolis Pond:—Off route No. 3 via Cardigan. There is good fishing on the Grand River near St. Georges.
National Park:—Route No. 6 Cousins Pond (Cavendish); Carr Pond (Stanhope).
Freelove:—Route No. 8 Seal's Pond and Stream.
Tyne Valley:—Route No. 13 Tyne Valley Mill Dam and Stream (located in village).
Elmira:—Route No. 18 East Lake; North Lake. Note: Ask Al Cumming at North Lake if fish are running. Ask Jim Harris at East Lake where to fish in the Lake.
Murray Harbor:—Route No. 13 Machon's Beach (the Buckle and Beach Point, Charlottetown and vicinity); Whalley River Pond and Stream (Whalley River); Ford's Pond (Brackley Point Road); Guernsey's Stream (Covehead Road); Marshall's Pond, Water River (Stafford); Keefer's Lake (rainbow trout); Johnston's River; Brax's Bridge; Giffenham Lake (rainbow trout); North River (Covehead); Corra's Beach Bridge.

Two Babies Die In Nfld. Blaze

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—Fire at suburban Killarde Tuesday claimed the lives of two babies and sent their parents and a brother to hospital for treatment of minor burns.

Firemen said the wooden home was an inferno of flames when they arrived and they

were almost huddled together and the nearest water was more than a mile away at a river.

The body of 15-month-old Sandra Humber was recovered, but late Tuesday firemen still were sifting the ruins of the bungalow for the body of her six-day-old sister, home from hospital since Sunday.

Treated at hospital and released were Arthur Humber, 40, St. John's mental hospital

employee, his wife Jean, and their three-year-old son Wayne. Mrs. Humber saved the boy by passing him through a window of the blazing building.

St. John's fire chief William Caddigan said the fire appeared to be caused by an exploding heater. Four other Humber children, ranging in age from seven to 13 years, were in school when the late morning blaze broke out.

Budget Makes No Provision For Magazine Advertising

OTTAWA (CP)—No provision was made in Tuesday night's budget for the government's announced plan to divert Canadian advertising dollars from United States publications printed here or in the U.S.

It was a major surprise of the speech delivered in the Commons by Finance Minister Fleming.


Prime Minister Diefenbaker announced Jan. 22 in the Commons that tax and tariff meas-

ures were contemplated "in due course" on two fronts.

Main target of the steps forecast are Time and Reader's Digest, whose Canadian editions have collared 40 per cent of Canadian magazine advertising.

Mr. Diefenbaker said the government had accepted the recommendations of the royal commission on publications that would ban magazines printed in other countries from Canada if they contained advertising directed mainly to the Canadian market.
