U. S. Halts Tariff Concessions To Soviet Bloc

Expect Red Envoys En Route To Kaesong For Cease-Fire Talks

(By Don Huth) TOKYO, July 6—(Saturday)—(AP)— Communist negotiators were presumed to be moving south today from Pyongyang in a 10-vehicle convoy, bound for a Sunday meeting at Kaesong with Allied representatives to discuss preliminaries for a Korean cease-fire conference.

Russian And Chinese Furs To Be Banned

WASHINGTON, July 6—(AP)—The United States has served notice on Russia and four satellite nations it is cancelling all American tariff concessions on goods they ship to the U.S. This action, announced today, was dictated by Congress, along with another move the State Department plans to take shortly, banning the importation of most furs from Russia and Communist China.

Air Force Announces Transfers For 3 Officers

OTTAWA, July 6—(CP)—The Air Force announced shifts for three of its top men today in a move dictated by the big expansion program now under way. Headquarters announced it has cancelled plans to post Air Vice Marshal F. R. Miller, 43, a native of Kamloops, B. C., to the National Defence College and that he will become Vice Chief of the Air Staff, the no. 2 man in the service.
