

Five Candidates Will Contest By-Elections At Lake St. John

QUEBEC (CP)—Provincial by-elections in Lake St. John and Labelle, Sept. 16 will be contested by five candidates. Until Wednesday only Premier Duplessis' Union Nationale party had candidates entered for the ridings. But before the 2 p.m. EDT nomination deadline two other candidates filed papers in Lake St. John and one in Labelle, north of Montreal.

The three-way race in Lake St. John is among Paul Levesque, mayor of Alma and candidate for the Union Nationale, Michel Chartrand of Montreal, Quebec leader of the Social Democratic (CCF) party, and Raymond Lapointe of Alma, running as an independent. Although Mr. Lapointe is listed as an independent he has the support of the Civic Action League—a political organization born in Montreal which until now has kept its activities on the municipal level.
