Opening lead — four of hearts. As the play progresses and the defenders contribute cards to the suits as they are led, the declarer has the opportunity to analyze and reconstruct the opponents' hands.

In some hands it is possible for declarer to know, after play has sufficiently advanced, exactly what cards each opponent has left, and in others, substantially

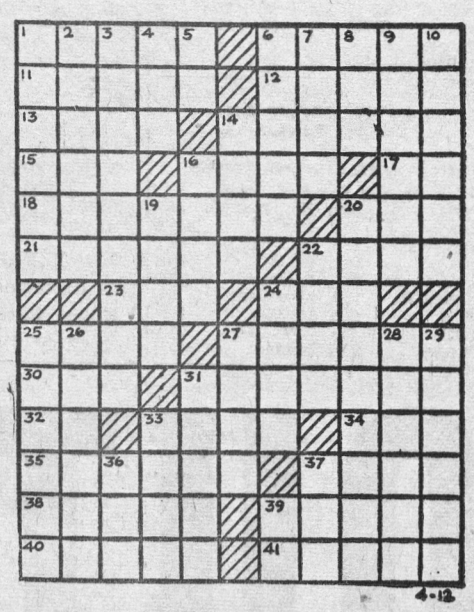
