A strengthened Moncton Hawks team will swing into action here tonight over Forum ice at 8:30 when they face-off with Murph Chamberlain's Charlottetown Islanders in Maritime Senior Hockey League play.

Encouraged with their win over Saint John on Saturday night, their first in nine starts, the Drillion-coached Hawks are expected to make it a keen tussle against the locals tonight when the Islanders skate out on the ice looking for their tenth straight victory of the season.

Players in Moncton livery who will be seen in action by local fans for the first time will include Charley Phillips and Jeanneau back on the blueline, while up front Win Mousseau, brother of teammate Whit Mousseau, and MacKenzie will be added power. Murray "Muzz" Richardson, who played with the Islanders up until a few days ago, is expected to be centering between Frank Imoff and Mousseau as Moncton's number one line of attack against his former teammates tonight.

Richardson was released to Moncton last week by coach Murph Chamberlain, and was a leading member of Moncton's front line that sparked them to victory Saturday night.

MONTREAL 5, NEW YORK 1

MONTREAL, Oct. 29 — (CP) — Montreal Canadiens overpowered New York Rangers 5-1 Saturday night before a crowd of 15,547 and the hapless Rangers still had to find their second win after seven starts in the new National Hockey League season.

Maurice Richard fired two goals in less than five minutes of play and was a continual threat. Floyd Curry, who played a rugged game, also bagged two and Ken Mosdell one.

In the scrappy third period Vern Kaiser of Canadiens and Alex Kaleta of Rangers were twice chased for high-sticking duels. On the first round a tripping penalty was added to Kaiser's time and on the second Kaleta was assessed a 10-minute misconduct penalty for a speech directed at referee Georges Gravel.

TORONTO 4, BOSTON 2

TORONTO, Oct. 29 — (CP) — Toronto Maple Leafs scored their fifth successive National Hockey League victory Saturday night, downing Boston Bruins 4-2 before 13,310 fans. The result kept the Leafs in front in the League race and ran their undefeated string to six straight games.

Rookie Danny Lewicki and veteran Ted Kennedy led the Leafs in their second conquest of the winless Bruins this season. The 19-year-old Lewicki got his first N. H. L. scoring points — a goal and two assists. Kennedy rapped home a pair of goals, his first this season. They brought his total in scheduled N. H. L. play to 149.

The Bruins lacked the attacking power to stay with the Leafs. They fired only 15 shots at goalie Al Rollins — veteran Turk Broda set out the game — while the Leafs had 26
