OTTAWA (CP) — Officially today they seriously doubt whether Canada will ever get into the atomic weapons business. They were commenting on Washington reports that Canada might join the United States and Britain in making atomic weapons development.

Prime Minister DeLoebner and Prime Minister Maclean of Britain said here Saturday night that Canada could play a large part in any pooling of scientific information among Western nations.
