## Physiologists Study Brain For Posture Clues

MONTREAL, (CP) — Recent knowledge gained in studying what happens inside the brain may help scientists, explain what gives a person good or bad posture.

Five of the world's leading students of the subject decided Wednesday new developments in neuro-physiology may open the door to more detailed knowledge of the basic mechanism of posture.

One of them, however, Dr. W. S. Kuffler of Baltimore, bluntly told visiting scientists at the 19th International Physiological Congress: "As long as no certain functional role can be assigned to some muscle or nerve element, our knowledge of posture will continue to be rudimentary."

### Face Major Task

Workers in the field still face a major task in trying to relate anatomical structures to function, he said.

All posture in living beings depends upon muscles in various parts of the body, but since muscles in turn are controlled by the nervous system—the brain's command reporting network—posture experts need to know what happens there.

At Wednesday symposium presided over by Professor F. Bremer of Brussels, Dr. Kuffler said he had found that there are several different types of nerve fibres controlling muscular contraction. In addition fibres causing contraction, there are other finer fibres in the same nerves, concerned only with small sustained adjustments of tension in the muscles.

Earlier members of another symposium, presided over by Prof. C. Heymans of Belgium, summed up what physiologists know today about the part played by heart and lungs in regulating and controlling the blood supply.

### Expert Gives Views

One expert, Prof. D. Whittieridge of Edinburgh, said several minute nerve fibres thought to have an important role in linking the heart and lungs with the blood system had still to be identified. But he held out hope that their location would "clear up many of our present difficulties."

An English member of the symposium, Dr. G. S. Dawes of Oxford, reviewed evidence concerning several control mechanisms believed used by the heart and lungs in controlling the blood flow. He said these reflexes caused "dramatic and sometimes well-nigh disastrous effects" by reducing blood pressure unduly, bringing about a change in the heart-beat or affecting breathing.
