# Traffic Cases Before Magistrate

In a concerted drive to apprehend car operators travelling at night with insufficient or faulty lights, the R.C.M.P. rounded up 16 offenders on Sunday night, most of whom appeared before Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet in Queen's County Magistrate's court during the same night. Thirteen of the drivers were found guilty and each fined \$4 and costs, or in default 5 days in jail. # Literature And Life

**SOME CEMENTS OF SOCIETY**

This phrase, which is very suggestive, is from Bishop Butler. It was used by him. Society is a body of people connected by some tie, or as Butler suggests, people cemented together. What are some of these cements? I shall mention four.

One is Language. We know how one in a strange place likes to hear his native tongue, how he is drawn to one he is a stranger if he is speaking the language of his childhood. You can usually tell the Irish, Scots, English, American, and people from various parts of our own province, by the sound of their voices. To use a Bible phrase "speech betrayeth thee". People who speak the "language of Eden" are drawn to one another. Language is one of the cements that unite the nations of the earth.

Patriotism is another. The war showed how people love their native land and are willing to sacrifice for it. Even those who were in foreign lands felt keenly the plight of the home country. The call to fight for one's hearth makes people fight for the time at least, forget their differences and stand together. We have known young people away from home, remember the place of their youth.

It may have been that they sent home money to aid in the upkeep of religion or to make provision for education. Some have even founded schools and attached the name of a favourite teacher, to whom they owed much, to it. They knew that the country place where they were brought up was becoming depleted and so would find it hard to maintain ordinances and out of gratitude for past blessings, sent aid as fortune prospered them.

A third uniting force is war. John Ruskin, who argued against war, said that nevertheless it brought out the good, as well as the bad, in people. It brought out their heroisms, it too was a school of unselfishness. It was said by a great man once that "if people did not hang together they would hang separately." War calls for unity. We have seen the need of this in the conflict that is closed in Europe. The "big three"—England, the United States and Russia for a while kept together, in spite of all that the Axis powers did to produce a cleavage. Had the smaller powers heeded the advice given them, and united, their story would have been different. Experience is a very expensive teacher.

Need, too, is a cement that tends to cement people. There is a saying that "necessity makes company." It binds folk together in more ways than one. Matthew Arnold, in one of his sonnets, tells how the poor are drawn together, "Some labouring men, whose work lay somewhere there, Passed opposite; she touched her girl, who hid her face in a shawl, Across, and begged, and came back satisfied, The rich she had let pass with frozen stare."

The tramp referred to would not think of asking aid from the rich.

But when we see the work of such an agency as the Red Cross, which leaps over barriers of race, creed and colour, we realize what a uniting cementing force it is. The call for help differs, but forget little differences. We recall how tragedies appeal to people. The Halifax Explosion touched the hearts of the continent. Earthquakes in other parts of the world, elicit sympathy. Europe now is in great need. Already food is on the verge of shortage. We will reduce our rations so that the hungry may be fed.

A Hebrew psalmist thought how fine a thing it was for people to feel their oneness, and he put it into the 133rd psalm—"How pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity." It was like pleasant ointment enveloping a garment, or like the dew that glistened upon the hills.

These are some of the cements that keep society together.
