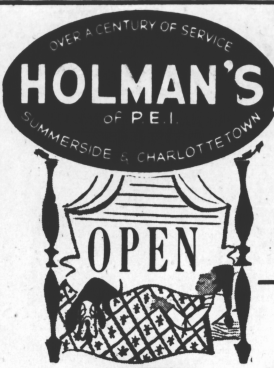
**WOMEN'S VOTE**
