DETROIT (AP)—Henry Ford II told the annual Ford stockholders meeting Thursday the "company now is enjoying the most successful operations in its long history."
Ford, chairman of the board, repeated his conviction that the U.S. auto industry will chalk up its first year of 9,000,000 new car sales in 1965.
Backing up his faith in the sales outlook, he disclosed that Ford has added about \$200,000,000 to expansion plans outlined to stockholders a year ago.
Ford saw nothing but expansion ahead for the world auto market.
"The demand for motor vehicles is rising steadily and rapidly throughout the world. We estimate that free world sales of cars, trucks and tractors will reach 22,500,000 this year — 1,500,000 above the record set last year," he said in his annual report.

Power Generation Shows Increase
OTTAWA (CP)—Net generation of electrical energy rose 3.2 per cent in March to 12,402,733,000 kilowatt hours from 11,935,941,000 in March last year, the bureau of statistics reported Thursday.
Imports rose to 297,296,000 from 297,822,000 and exports fell to 292,847,000 from 333,486,000 kilowatt hours in March this year compared with March, 1964.
