NOTICE. To Water Consumers. The attention of Water Takers is directed to the following Sections of the Charlottetown Water Works By-Laws as amended, by order of the Board. They will in future be more strictly enforced.

Section 7.—Water Takers shall prevent all unnecessary waste, and water shall not be left running to prevent freezing. There shall be no concealment of the purposes for which water is used.

Section 8.—Any person supplied with water shall not allow another to take water from their fixture without written permission of the Water Commissioners.

Section 9.—No increase or extension of fixtures shall be allowed without written permission of the Board.
