## Local and Other Items.

FOR MEDICAL OFFICERS.—An Ottawa despatch says: A reserve for medical officers has been created by the militia department. Medical officers who resigned or vacated regimental appointments since June 30th will be eligible.

GETTING GOOD PAY.—The New Zealand contingent, which is now at the Cape, is composed of a force of mounted rifles consisting of 210 officers and men. The government allowed and paid, besides ordinary pay for each officer and man, the sum of £10 for his personal expenses. While on service, the contingent is to be paid per day by the New Zealand government, according to the scale of their volunteer regulations, as follows: commanding officers, 21s.; surgeon, 18s.; captains 15s.; lieutenants, 11s.; sergeants-major, 8s.; sergeants, 6s.; corporals, 5s.; trumpeters, 4s. The Canadian private on service receives 1s. per day, even which small amount our government refuses to pay, saddling it on Great Britain; while the New Zealander is paid by his own country, gladly, willingly, 4 shillings.
