MP Publicity Hounds Draw Ire Of Premier

Statements, some of which are guesswork and some designed to beat the sun are being made by Island members of Parliament, said Premier Walter R. Shaw Monday as he criticized some members of parliament who have made such statements.

As an example, he said statements have been made about the location of a second national park in the province and statements have been made about this province being declared a "designated area" under the federal program of granting incentives for new industry.

"Recently," the premier said "there was a conference in Ottawa, attended by our top officials, to discuss certain matters of industrial importance, particularly regarding new criteria for the naming of designa t e d areas."

"It was a confidential meeting and we accepted it on that basis without commenting on deliberations only to find some federal members came out in the press, making statements as to the expected plans of the federal government in naming areas."

MacPhail To Be Sworn Wednesday

Lloyd MacPhail, P.C. 2nd Queens, will be sworn into cabinet at 11 o'clock Wednesday morning by Lieutenant Governor W. J. MacDonald.

Mr. MacPhail joins the cabinet as a result of a cabinet shuffle announced about two weeks ago by Premier Walter R. Shaw. He is the only new member as other ministers changed portfolios.

Mr. MacPhail will assume the portfolios of Industry and Natural Resources and Tourist Development.

Resignation of Hon. J. David Stewart, who held the portfolios of provincial secretary, tourist development and municipal affairs is effective tomorrow.

Co-Operative Housing Gets Praise Here

Alexander Laidlaw, national secretary of the Co-operative Union of Canada praised Prince Edward Island's co-operative housing program. Mr. Laidlaw is also a director of Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation.

In a letter to William Meggison, chairman of the P.E.I. Housing Commission, he said, "while in Charlottetown, a group of us visited an attractive housing project of some 40 to 50 homes. This is easily one of the best projects of its kind I have seen in all Canada."

Under the provincial housing program, 12 groups have built 109 co-operative homes.

Mr. Meggison said today a group has been formed in Georgetown and may proceed with a co-operative home project.

Electric Power Requirements To Be Discussed

Prince Edward Island's electric power requirements will be discussed today by representatives of power companies from Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and local cabinet members who will meet in the Provincial Building.

Premier Walter R. Shaw said Monday "the government is interested in this province getting the best method of power supply in sufficient quantities and at the best possible price to consumers."

Discussions will centre around the Atlantic Development Board proposal that a power cable be laid across Northumberland Strait to provide added power for the province.

Fine Of \$50, Suspension Given Driver

The accused appeared before Magistrate James E. Johnston, Q.C. in Queen County Magistrate's Court Monday morning.
