

# Erhard Takes Chance In Choice Of Minister

**BONN** (AP)—Chancellor Erhard has risked collapse of his coalition government by appointing a member of his own Christian Democratic party as West Germany's new justice minister.

He picked Karl Weber, 67, a relatively unknown Bundestag (parliamentary) delegate, to succeed Free Democrat Ewald Bucher, a former Nazi, who quit Thursday after parliament overrode him and voted to continue the hunt for Nazi murderers five more years.

Bucher had wanted the hunt stopped this year. His Free Democratic Party, the smaller member of the coalition, backed him 100 per cent. It demanded that the justice ministry position be left unfilled until after the Sept. 19 parliamentary election, in order to keep attention focused on the issue.

The Free Democrats hold the

balance of power in the present parliament but indications are that they face serious losses and possible extinction in the election. They think they have found a way to make a comeback by advocating an end to new prosecutions of war crimes.

Free Democrats would be serious, but not necessarily fatal. Under the West German constitution he could go on ruling with a minority government until the election.

The chancellor, caught between domestic politics and world opinion, has avoided getting too closely identified with one side or the other in the Nazi murderers dispute. He said last summer he would consider it monstrous if any Nazi murderers got off free. But in November he and his cabinet decided

against continuing the hunt after May 8, the 20th anniversary of the end of the Second World War.

## Economic Problems Are Second

**MONTREAL** (CP)—There is no point in considering Canada's economic problems until French and English-speaking Canadians are prepared to resolve cultural differences, says labor leader Jean Marchand.

"Otherwise all the verbal planning in the world isn't going to mean a thing," said Mr. Marchand, president of the Quebec-based Confederation of National Trade Unions.

He was speaking here at a conference held by the Quebec Young Liberal Federation on the theme of future economic problems affecting Quebec.

Mr. Marchand said: "A nation, as well as an individual, is capable of doing crazy, irrational things and in this country right now there are people within both the French and English groups who are acting without motives."

"Within such a situation the economic repercussions can, of course, be disastrous."

"The reason for this present crisis is weakness in the federal government at a time when strong, stable government is most needed."

Mr. Marchand said each province has its own economic development machinery and as a result a move toward constructive co-operative planning is vital.

In Quebec, he said, the English underestimate cultural and linguistic problems while the French underestimate the economic problems.

## Indonesia Gets New Press Law

**JAKARTA** (AP)—A new press law issued here stipulates that all the Indonesian dailies and magazines should be owned by Indonesians.

Each publication must be supported by at least three political or mass organizations registered at the semi-official Front organization, a decree said.

The new law was issued after the government in the last month dissolved 29 newspapers and periodicals that supported the banned Body for the Promotion of Sukarnoism. The movement fought the Indonesian Communist party.

The new press law stipulated that newspapers and periodicals may be dissolved if their respective supporters—the political or mass organizations—are dissolved or if the publications are "used in contradiction to the teaching of the great leader of the revolution Bung Karno (President Sukarno)."

Newspapers and periodicals may also be banned if they "damage the principle of Pancasila," that is co-operation among nationalist, religious and Communist groups.
