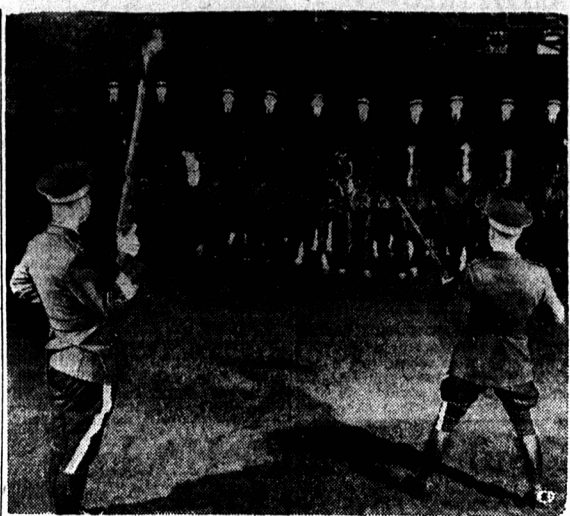

**Horse May Spoil Melbourne Chances For Olympic Games**

MELBOURNE (AP) — Even if all other obstacles are overcome, the humble horse may deprive Melbourne of the 1956 Olympic games. A three-day equestrian event and Grand Prix de Nations are compulsory sports at the games. But the only way horses from countries other than England or New Zealand can enter Australia is by first serving a six-month quarantine period in England.

The problem now is whether European, U.S., Russian, Mexican and Argentinian horsemen will go through the expensive procedure of sending their mounts to England for six months before the games.

The chief quarantine officer for Victoria, J. de Courcy Talbot, said there is absolutely no chance of any relaxation of the regulations.

## Mt. A. Edges S. D. U. 7-6 In Intercollegiate Hockey At Sackville

SACKVILLE, N. B.—Feb. 15—A. J. MacAdam's Saint Dunstan's University hockey team put on a torrid third period drive to score four goals here Saturday night but their all-out effort wasn't quite enough as they fell before Mount Allison University 7-6 in an intercollegiate hockey game.

The Mounties raced into a commanding 6-1 lead in the first half of the game and then fell apart under the Saints driving attacks. Only the outstanding work of goalie Lloyd Hicks in the Mounties cage prevented the Saints from winning the contest.

As a result of their victory the Mounties win the first section of the N.B.-P.E.I. playdowns by taking the two game series from Saint Dunstan's by a 13-7 count. Mount A defeated Saint Dunstan's 6-1 here a week ago in the opening game.

Big John Neilson, first string Mount Allison centre, paced the Mounties to victory by scoring three goals and assisting on one more. Doug MacLeod, Bud Robertson, Art Wells and Bob MacDonald scored singles for the winners.

Centremen Pierre Michaud scored twice for Saint Dunstan's in the last period. Louis MacDonald, Maurice Flynn, Rusty Callaghan and Paul Jay were the other S. D. U. marksmen.

The Mounties outplayed the Saints in the opening period and rapped four goals past over-worked Wilfred Gillis in the S. D. U. cage before the local collegians got on the score sheet.

The Saints reversed matters in the second period and controlled the play although they were outscored 2-1. Hicks of the Mounties had 15 stops to make in this session.

The Saints made their scoring chances count in the final frame. They scored three of their goals in less than two minutes with Michaud, Jay and Callaghan being the marksmen.

The Saints suffered a tough break in the opening minutes of the first period when defenseman Ed Dalton was cut by a stick on the side of the head. Dalton missed the remainder of the period but returned for the last two sessions to turn in a heads up game. While he was out for repairs the Red and White played with only two defensemen, Dick Wedge and Louis MacDonald.

Wedge and MacDonald both turned in strong efforts with MacDonald scoring. The Saints first goal after intercepting a pass hitting the cordage on a blue line shot.

Michaud's first goal came on a long shot from the blue line. Jay scored on MacIsaac's rebound and Callaghan tipped home Cliff Ready's rebound. Michaud scored the Saints final goal on a pass
