## Local and Other Items.

**DON'T MISS THEM**—The Montreal Weekly Star and the WEEKLY EXAMINER both papers from now until the end of the year for 20 cents.

**SONS OF TEMPERANCE**—The fiftieth annual session of the Grand Division of P E Island will open at Fredericton, on Monday, the 24th of October next, at 10 a. m., and adjourn the same evening, to meet at Charlottetown the following day, where the jubilee celebration of the introduction of the Order here will be held.

**COLD STORAGE**—The Kensington Dairying Association are about erecting a cold storage building to complete their outfit for butter making. The milk supply at Kensington Factory this season is a record breaker, about 500,000 lbs per month. So far the make of cheese is: large, 433 boxes in June, 663 in July, 668 in August, and about 650 in September. The outlook is good for 3000 boxes this year.

**BUYING UP APPLES**—According to an exchange bayer of apples are making it interesting for the farmers throughout Nova Scotia. Mr T D Ouderdonk, of an Ontario firm, is buying great quantities of them in the region of Ganing and is paying for them, when delivered at the warehouse, at the rate of \$2.00 per barrel for the entire orchard. This gentleman is also building an evaporating factory in Canning which will consume the culls. If he finds the farmers to patronize it, he will build a large one capable of handling 100 barrels per day. His firm owns three in Ontario.

**INTERESTING TO FRUIT GROWERS**—In compliance with the request of His Honor Lieutenant-Governor Howland, Supt Sharp has kindly consented to issue return tickets at one first-class fare from all stations on the P E I R, to farmers and fruit growers who will attend the meeting of the P E I Fruit Growers Association on Oct 4th, and on the return trip present a certificate of attendance from the secretary of the Fruit Growers Association to the Conduc or. Those tickets will be issued for the afternoon train from the west on Oct 3rd, good for return on the afternoon of the following day; and on the morning train from the east on Oct 4th, good for return on the same and following day. Member present will be furnished with certificates of attendance.

## THE PORTE PROTESTS.

Addresses Another Circular Regarding Disarmament of Mussulmans.

**CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept 26.**—The Porte has addressed another circular to the four powers controlling affairs in Crete, protesting against the disarmament of Mussulmans in the island unless Christians are also disarmed simultaneously. There have been a great many arrests of Mussulmans here within the last few days. The motive for the arrests is not known.

## ITALY AND COLOMBIA

**ROME, Sept 26.**—The Italian Government has called the attention of the Government of the United States to the incorrect attitude of the Government of Colombia, and demanded that the latter respect its treaties, otherwise Italy reserves to herself the right to adopt the energetic measures towards Colombia which were recently abandoned in deference to the United States Government.

## BUILDING A FLEET.

**R. G. Reid, owner of the steamer Bruce, is having several large and fast steamers built at Glasgow, Scotland. The steamers are to be ready by the spring. One of them, it is said, will run between St. John's, Halifax and Boston, while the others are principally for the coastal service.—North Sydney Herald 1.**
