Fisheries Case Again Adjourned

SUMMERSIDE—Two Alberton South fishermen, Reginald A. and Upton J. Fraser had their cases adjourned for judgement until Dec. 29, following the completion of evidence in county magistrate's court here yesterday before Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald.

Reginald Fraser pleaded not guilty to separate charges of failing to bring to when told by a protection officer and of having the unlawful possession of lobsters in a place, where at that time, fishing for such fish was prohibited.

Upton Fraser also pleaded not guilty to the possession charge. During the day-long hearing, three witnesses for the crown and three for the defence were heard. Crown witnesses were Fishery Officers Duda, MacKay and Douglas who all swore that Upton Fraser was in the boat when the offence took place. Defence witnesses, Philip Kinch, James Gallant and the accused, Upton Fraser, all testified that Upton was helping Kinch take the engine out of the boat when the offence was said to have taken place.

Islanders Buy Holstein Sire

The sale of the Holstein bull, Elmcroft Rag Apple Tim, to Al-lissa Profit and Sons of Free-town was announced yesterday by the former owner, George R. MacLaughlin of Elmcroft Farms, Beaverton, Ontario.

Tim is a double grandson of Elmcroft Scepter Ex., being sired by Elmcroft Rag Apple Jasper V.G., whose V.G. dam has over 135,000 lbs. milk in 7 lactations. Jasper's V.G. full sister has just completed her 3-year-old record of 35142 per cent—F142 per cent (over 37,000 lbs. in 305 days). Tim's dam is Elmcroft Rita A. Jean B. V.G., with a 3 lactation BCSA average of 85.61 per cent—F141 per cent. She has

four maternal sisters in the Elmcroft herd.

Tim's maternal sister was let wet 3-year-old and Reserve Grand Champion at the 1959 Peterboro Championship Show.

He represents a most successful blending of the blood of such great sires as Montvic Monogram (Ex-Extra), Montvic Rag Apple Triune (Ex), Montvic Rag Apple Blackman (Ex-Extra), Montvic

Rag Apple Ajax (Ex), and Montvic Rag Apple Hobbsman.

Mr. MacLaughlin also reported the sale of Tim's sire, Jasper, to the Kentucky artificial breeding association for \$5,000 on condition that the frozen semen be made available to the Elmcroft herd free of charge. Mr. MacLaughlin states that this semen from this bull is being used heavily in his Beaverton herd.

Order No. 47
THE MILK PROTECTION ACT

Take notice milk distributors and vendors in Charlottetown and Summerside areas that by Order No. 47 of the Prince Edward Island Milk Control Board passed on the 25th day of November A.D. 1959, the price of blend cream beginning January 1st, 1960 shall be as follows:

Minimum fat 8%		
Retail per quart	40c	Wholesale per quart
Retail per pint	20c	Wholesale per pint
Retail per half pint	11c	Wholesale per half pint

● The price to the producer of standard milk manufactured into blend shall be paid for at \$1.20 per pound butterfat.

● All milk received from producers in the areas of Charlottetown and Summerside shall be paid for at the rate of \$1.20 per pound butterfat.

● The price of milk in quart paper containers shall be 3c higher, wholesale and retail, than the price charged for milk in quart glass containers.

The price per quart of homogenized-pasteurized milk in bulk dispenser cans delivered to restaurants, hotels, motels and the R. C. A. F. Station in St. Eleanors shall be—

(a) When the distributor owns and maintains the dispenser 20c

(b) Where the purchaser owns and maintains the dispenser 19c

(c) To hospitals, 18c and only homogenized-pasteurized milk may be sold.

The price per quart of pasteurized-homogenized milk delivered to the National Park area in refrigerated trucks shall be 3c higher than the price delivered in Charlottetown and Summerside areas.
