THE NEWS FROM OTTAWA.

Proceedings in the Senate and Commons.

William Ferguson Honored—Sir Donald Smith's Latest Offer.

OTTAWA, June 8.—Replying to Mr. Tay-
lor, Hon. Mr. Davies said that for the
purpose of shortening the session many Gov-
ernment bills had been dropped, including
the plebiscite bill.

This being private members' day, a
number of orders of local interest were
called, and several private bills were ad-
vanced a stage. Casey's bicycle bill
went through the committee and was read
a third time. The alien labor bill, as
amended by Hon. Mr. Davies' amendment,
making it only operative on the initiation
of persecution by the Government, also got
a third reading.

Hon. Senator Ferguson has received
information that his son Mr. William S.
Ferguson has been elected to a fellowship
in Cornell University.

Sir Donald Smith has cabled Lady
Aberdeen an unconditional subscription of
\$5,000 for the Victorian order of Nurses
with a promise of another \$5,000 as soon
as \$100,000 is subscribed in sums larger
than \$1,000.

Hon. Mr. Fielding gives notice of a
resolution to pay Manitoba \$300,000 for
public school purposes out of the school
fund held in trust by the Dominion.

In the Senate an amendment to the
criminal code was adopted imposing a fine
of \$1,000 or a year's imprisonment or any
person living in open and notorious
adultery.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

CONSTANTINOPLE, June 6.—It is reported
that armed Bulgarian bands have crossed
the frontier near Kosovna, and a large
force of troops has been sent to that point.

TORONTO, June 6.—The United States
regulation regarding tea promises to have
a serious effect on the tea trade in Canada.
Already large quantities of adulterated tea,
refused admission by the United States
customs officers, have diverted to Canada,
and a prominent dealer says that ten
thousand packages now in transit will
follow it and help flood this country.

DENVER, Col., June 6.—A special to the
News from El Paso, Texas, says that
Francis Schlatter, who claimed to perform
miraculous cures by Divine power, was
recently found dead in the foothills of the
Sierra Madre, 35 miles southwest of Casa-
grande, in the state of Chihuahua, Mexico.
He had been fasting and apparently starved
to death. While in Denver from August
22 to November 13, 1895, about 200,000
people visited Schlatter to receive treat-
ment.

LONDON, June 6.—At the military tourna-
ment on Saturday for Canadians competed in
the bayonet versus bayonet bouts against four
members of the New South Wales mounted
rifles. The Canadian team won easily.

MADRID, June 6.—The Queen-regent has
confirmed Don Porcayo, the premier, in
his ministerial powers and the cabinet will
remain in office with policy unchanged.
All the leading members of the Senate and
Chamber of Deputies who were consulted
by Her Majesty, as well as three Marshal-
have advised the recall of Captain General
Weyler from Cuba.
