One thousand eight hundred and six-three, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five and one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six; the same to be under the superintendance of two Commissioners to be appointed by the Government for that purpose, who are hereby empowered to omit all expired Statutes as in former cases of reprinting the Laws, the said reprinting and binding to be let by tender, and, if possible, the Statutes of the present Session to be bound up with the Statutes of the previous four years above mentioned, a sum sufficient.
