

Liberal Nominate Prosper Arsenault, Robert Campbell

ALBERTON — Two men with long records in the Liberal Party have been nominated as Liberal candidates in the First Prince at the Liberal Convention in Alberton, Tuesday night.

Prosper A. Arsenault, nominated as assemblyman, is a member of the Maritime government for three years and served as a minister without portfolio. He is a lifelong resident of Howland and has 23 years experience as a school teacher, 20 years in this province and five years in Western Canada. He is studying at St. Bonaventure's, holds a diploma in pedagogy from St. Joseph's and a certificate in child psychology from Ottawa University.

Robert E. Campbell, nominated as councillor, was born near Alberton, has lived there all his life and is a farmer livestock dealer. He is past president of the West Prince Liberal Association and also president of the West Prince Young Liberal Association, and at present is the vice-president of the executive of the provincial Liberal association.

He is also a member of the Alberton and West Prince Board of Trade, vice-president of the Alberton Retarded Children's Association, a trustee of Alberton District Regional High School. During the Second World War he served overseas with the Merchant Navy, joining at the age of 17.

OLD AND YOUNG
The principal speaker was A. W. Matheson, provincial leader of the party. He commended the wisdom of old and young working together and expressed confidence that Mr. Arsenault and Mr. Campbell working together would make a great team. He also expressed pleasure in seeing so many young men among the poll delegates. "That", he said, "is true Liberalism at work."
