BY-LAWS ARE AMENDED

APEC Plans Co-operation  
With Development Board

HALIFAX (CP)—The Atlantic Provinces Economic Council has approved four amendments to its bylaws providing for co-operation with the Atlantic Development Board and the Atlantic Provinces Research Board and increased promotion of regional economic programs.

The second amendment stated that APEC would "advocate and support sound policies to promote a higher rate of economic growth in the Atlantic provinces."  
The statement said APEC has worked with governments and sector bodies to bring into being the institutional framework required for the implementation of the policies necessary to promote a higher rate of economic growth in the Atlantic region.

This would replace the present policy "to act as a spokesman outside the Atlantic region on business and industry."  
Outgoing president Gerald E. Martin said in his report the formation of new provincial development agencies and the establishments of various other incentives had given rise to a new spirit of optimism and determination throughout Canada.
