Consumer Price Index Jolted By Food Costs

 OTTAWA (CP)—Soaring food costs jolted the consumer-price index to a record 140.2 in November. Its previous high was 139.5 in July.
 The Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported Wednesday that the index, chief barometer of Canadian living costs, gained almost a full point from the October figure of 139.3.
 In November of last year it stood at 135.9. That meant a jump in the year on index of 4.3 points, equal to 3.2 per cent. Economists say price gains should be held to between 1½ and two per cent in a year.
 DBS said its cross-country check of November food prices—one of the major components in the index—showed an increase of 1.8 per cent from October levels.
 "Substantially higher" prices were reported for eggs, potatoes, tomatoes, celery and lettuce.

...ce. There were smaller gains for fresh milk, most beef and pork items, fish, poultry, lard, margarine, coffee, canned tomatoes, peaches and pears.
CLOTHING COSTS MORE
 Higher costs were also reported in four of the other six index components — housing, clothing, health - personal, care and recreation - reading. The transportation section was unchanged and the tobacco-alcohol index dipped slightly.
 There is no exactly comparable index for family incomes but DBS compiles one on average industrial wages and salaries which also uses 1949 as equalling 100. In September — latest available — This stood at 214.8 compared to 212.5 in August and 204.8 in the previous September.
 The consumer price index is based on a sampling of prices for a fixed quantity of goods and services needed by urban families of from two to six persons. These are families who had incomes of between \$2,500 and \$7,000 a year in 1957 and live in centres of 30,000 population or over. Housing and food count for 60 per cent of the items checked.
 The wage index is compiled from a wide list of industrial firms that employ 15 or more persons.
 DBS breaks its main price index down into seven components. Here is how each fared between October and November

Food—Index up to 138.2 from 135.7 with a wide list of price gains offsetting slightly lower prices for grapefruit, bananas, hamburger, bacon, lamb, veal, sugar, cake mix, powdered skim milk, onions and turnips.
 Housing—Index increased to 142 from 141.6 on higher costs of rent, taxes, repairs, furniture, textiles, utensils and equipment. Fuel oil and household supplies were slightly down.
 Clothing — Index moved to 123.7 from 123.2 on higher prices for piece goods and footwear. Men's and children's wear were up, women's wear unchanged.
 Transportation — Index unchanged from October at 148.7. Auto prices rose in some cities, balanced by drops in others. Gasoline and oil prices were higher but train fares were down.
 Health and personal care — Index ahead to 177.9 from 177. Price of prescriptions and drugs were higher along with men's haircuts, women's hair-dressing and personal supplies.
 Recreation and reading—Index up to 155 from 154.2 with increases in movie tickets, skates, hockey sticks and camera film.
 Alcohol and tobacco — Index down to 122.3 from 122.6 after scattered price decreases or cigarettes.
