Demands U. N. Investigate The Rebellion in Algeria

TUNIS (AP)—President Habib Bourguiba fired another shot in his feud with France Sunday, demanding a United Nations investigation of the rebellion in neighboring Algeria.

Bourguiba said he had instructed Tunisia's UN delegate, Mongi Slim, to file the demand with the UN Security Council.

It would be an enlargement of Tunisia's protest to the UN against the French bombing of the border village of Sakiet Sidi Youssef Feb. 8. That complaint is scheduled for UN debate Tuesday.

"It is time for the whole free world to take a stand on Algeria," Bourguiba said. "One can no longer continue the fiction that it is only an affair for France."

Bourguiba's latest move came as the United States was reported working to keep the crisis over the bombing from reaching the United Nations.

Western quarters fear a UN debate would give the Communists one more sounding board to undermine the West's position in North Africa.

BLACKSMITH
The man who is renowned as one of the best blacksmiths in Massachusetts, and who, during his career of 50 years at turning out shoes for trotters and pacers, shod more than 75,000 horses, died, last week at St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Cambridge, Mass. He was Lawrence (Larry) Brignolia.

In his early youth, he was one of the best distance runners in the United States, and he won the Boston Marathon in 1899. He was also an oarsman in the late 90's, and in 1898 won the junior single sculls championship. He was in the habit of working in his blacksmith's shop through the day then in the evening, to don his running clothes and trot some five to ten miles an evening.

In an interview before his death, he stated that before autos were common, blacksmithing was a great trade. "We had all types of animals—workhorses, show steeds, pacers, trotters and fine harness horses that ladies and gentlemen drove about in beautiful carriages. The prize that he cherished most was a life-sized statue of mercury, which was awarded to him for winning the

MAINE CIRCUIT

We have had inquiries about the dates of the 1958 Maine racing circuit. Here they are: Cumberland, May 19-31; Lewiston, June 2 to 21; Gorham, June 23 to July 19; Bangor, July 21 to August 2; Presque Isle, August 4 to 9; Skowhegan (State Fair), August 11 to 16; Union, August 18 to 23; Winslow, August 25 to September 1; Lewiston, September 1 to 6; Norway-South Paris, September 8-13; Farmington, September 15 to 20; Farmington, September 22 to 27; Fryeburg, September 29 to October 4; Topsham, October 6 to 11; Topsham, October 13 to 25. The dates from November 15 are still to be assigned.

LONG SEASON
Dow Clowater writes us that there are between 40 and 50 horses training at the Fredericton track, and that the 1958 harness racing season will be the longest in the history of the Fredericton raceway. It will get underway on June 2 and will conclude October 13, with racing each Monday and Thursday nights, except during Exhibition Week, the first week in September, when meets will be staged September 1, 4 and 6.

This will give the Fredericton Raceway 40 meets, with a minimum of 320 dashes. The big event again this year will be the Walter Dale Memorial Race, which will be staged August 7 with a purse of \$3,000. This is a two-horse event, with most of the top free-for-alls in the Maritime provinces competing. Other features will be a \$1,000 junior free-for-all on Labor Day, September 1, and a \$2,000 free-for-all on September 4. Raceway officials are also considering having a special event for three-year-old trotters and pacers some time during the season.

The writer has a very pleasant recollection of Fredericton track and its people. In 1936, I won the free-for-all Trot with Heatherbell in 2:08 1/2, 2:08 1/2 and 2:08 3/4, and the 2:20 Trot with the little Newfoundland mare Harvest Melody, best time 2:10 1/2. Drivers in that race included Henry Clukey and Earl Avery.
