The Longshoremen of St. John, N. B., have taken against steam winches. They object to the use of them on account of the danger they are considered to be liable slipping out of the slings. Their demand is acceded to, twelve laborers will be employed to do the work of seven men and a donkey engine.

He came here highly recommended, as very active in all Parochial work, and an excellent preacher.

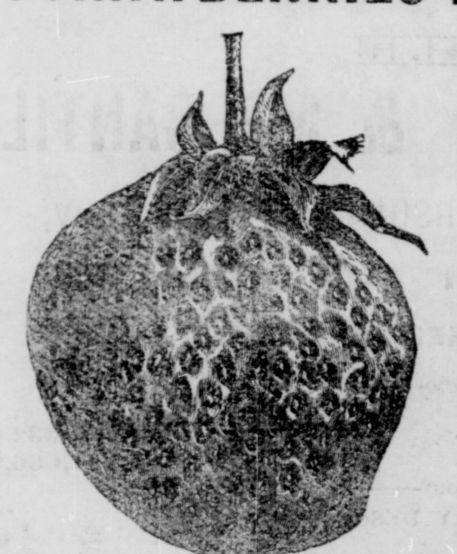
