THE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM.

Municipal potato patches to tide the unemployed over the winter were planted in Detroit this year at the instance of Mayor Pingree. The result is stated in a despatch from Detroit to the effect that some 15,000 bushels have been raised, which will go a considerable way towards helping the poor of the city during the months when work is scarcest among them.

According to Col. H. G. Prout, editor of the Railway Gazette, railway travelling is the most successful in the United States and the safest in the old country. The United States' railways run the fastest trains in the world, but they kill sixteen times as many people as those of the United Kingdom in proportion to the number carried.
