**Church Group To Meet On Centennial Plans**

OTTAWA (CP) — Representatives of 28 religions, sects, churches and faiths will meet here July 5 in the most widely representative inter-faith conference held in Canada at the invitation of a government agency.

All groups approached by the commission accepted the invitation but the Jehovah's Witnesses, a commission source said. The conference was called at the suggestion of a group of church leaders meeting here in March. They decided the time was ripe for an ecumenical approach to centennial planning by religious communities in Canada, both for national observance of the anniversary and for an international demonstration of Canadian unity.

Invitations were also sent for the July 5 meeting to representatives of the Evangelical Baptist Churches of Canada, the Christian and Missionary Alliance, the Christian Science Church, and the Ukrainian Greek, Romanian, and Syrian Antiochian Orthodox churches.

Others invited were: The Byelorussian Autocephalic Orthodox Church, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, the Menonite Brethren, the Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada, Baha'i World Faith, the Canadian Islamic Centre, Orthodox, Liberal and Conservative Syn-

Acceptances and endorsements have been received in reply to invitations sent to Maurice Cardinal Roy, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Quebec, Most Rev. H. H. Clark, Anglican Primate of Canada, and the moderators and presidents of the United, Presbyterian and Baptist churches.

In addition to the Christian churches, representatives will attend the meeting for the Orthodox, Liberal and Conservative Jewish faiths, and Islamic, Unitarian and Baha'i churches.

In addition to the church leaders, Dr. Wilder Penfield, famed Montreal neurosurgeon and president of the Vanier Institute on the family; Claude Ryan, editor-in-chief of Le Devoir, Montreal; and J. Roby Kidd, director of the Social Science Research Council, Ottawa, were invited to contribute a layman's approach.

**Enforcement Is Discussed Of Proposed Duck Licence**

WINNIPEG (CP) — Canada's provincial game directors have been told that it is expected provincial wildlife and RCMP officers will enforce a proposed federal duck licence for migratory bird hunters.

Dr. David A. Munro, chief of the federal government's Canadian wildlife service, made the remark Wednesday in answer to a question during discussions at the 29th Federal-Provincial Wildlife Conference.

G. W. Malaher, Manitoba's wildlife director, who asked the question, suggested this would mean provincial officers would have to enforce a regulation im-

posed by the federal government. Dr. Munro introduced the discussion with an outline of federal proposals including a licence which would provide a means of obtaining names and addresses of all migratory bird hunters so that a survey might be made among them to determine numbers and kinds of migratory birds harvested.

**U.S. HAS STAMP**  
It was considered likely the licence would be in the form of a duck stamp which the hunter would be required to carry in addition to provincial licences were required. A similar duck-stamp program has been im-

posed in the United States for about 20 years.

There has been no firm indication of what the stamp would cost. With an estimated 350,000 migratory bird hunters in Canada, however, a \$1 fee would produce about \$350,000 a year.

Dr. Munro said the best estimate on cost of producing the stamps and conducting the survey is about \$200,000.

Dr. Munro also said 1966 is the earliest date for which a duck stamp could be implemented.

Proceeds, which would go into federal revenue, would not be big enough to cover another federal proposal for waterfowl habitat work which Dr. Munro said federal authorities hoped would be undertaken in co-operation with provincial authorities.

Sixteen months ago, when they arrived in London from Munich, where Miss Rice-Davies had been playing in a cabaret, she told reporters: "We hope to marry just as soon as Pierre can settle his divorce."

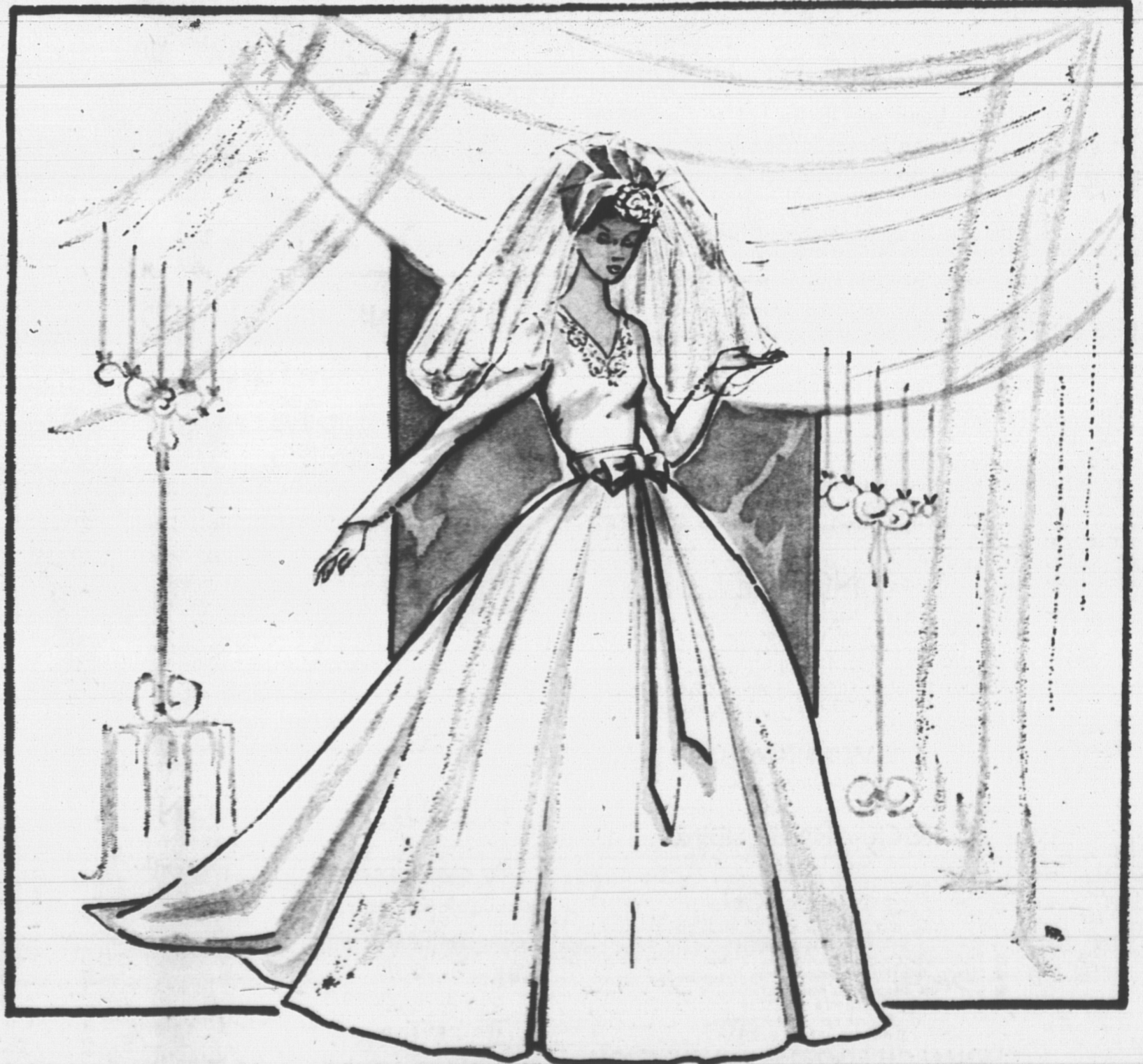

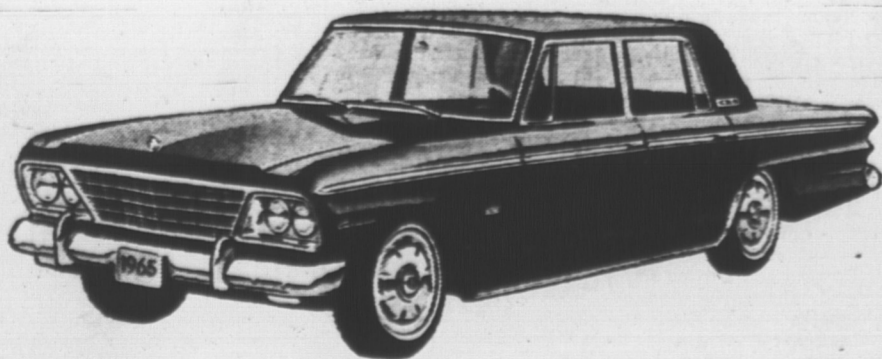
