A friend has passed us an official program from Saratoga Raceway, Saratoga Springs, N.Y., and in the fourth race on the program, which had eleven starters, Frenchman, owned by Dodson Horse Exchange, Montreal, and driven by Bob Ryan, was the winner in 2:04 4/5. The event carried a purse of \$4,500.

This is a new record for Frenchman. His record last year was 2:06, taken in 1935 as a five-year-old. He was formerly owned by James Given of Halifax.

In a late issue of the Boston Sunday Globe, there is a page devoted to harness horse doing. It shows a blacksmith shoeing a horse, a caretaker getting his harness ready for the fray, a trainer studying the angle of a horse's foot, and finally an excellent picture of Danny Steele, whose residence is Brighton, near Boston.

Danny is a native of Summerside, P.E.I., and was racing on the track in the 1920's. His father brought the stallion "Parkside" from the Leland-Stanford Farm in California to be delivered to W.A. Brennan of Summerside.

BREAK ACCIDENT

A freak accident at Hindsdale Raceway, Ohio, three days before opening night sidelined driver Cliff (Tag) Boyd possibly for two or three months. Boyd suffered pelvic injuries and a fractured leg while exercising one of his horses when another horse, out of control, jumped into the infield parking his sulky on the rail, and then jumped back out on the track again, right on top of Boyd.

Race secretary E. Frank Acorn has lined up two splendid programs for Saturday and Monday nights. Spectators will see a good selection of the best of the 2 1/2 year colts in action, and we believe that the pacing record for the season — 2:10 2/5 set up by Mr. Rock, driven by Cyril Smith — will be lowered tonight. Monday night's card will also see some new pacers in action, also some trotters. So it should be an interesting evening. Of particular interest to Island breeders is the fact that the first division of the 2:25 Pace, which drew the largest entry list in any Maritime early-closer with one exception (40 entries), will be raced on Monday night with eight starters. Some of these horses will be among the tops in years to come, so take a good look at them.

There is also an "AA" Pace, which has seven starters including the free-legged pacer, Ginger E., that Lorne Kelly won with the other night in 2:11. He will have strong opposition from Peter Federal, Jean Clegg, Betty French, Donald Clegg, and stalag Hanover. The latter will be making his first start of the season; he will race free-legged, and it will be his first appearance in a race without hobbles.

Florentino Fernandez Stops Stefan Redl In 7th Round

NEW YORK (AP) — Cuba's Florentino Fernandez stopped Hungarian-born Stefan Redl in 1:07 of the seventh round Friday night to lead a successful three-man Latin American invasion of Madison Square Garden. Fernandez weighed 144 1/2, Redl 147. Capt. Felipe Matos, director of sports in Cuba, jumped into the ring and wrapped the Cuban flag around Fernandez after referee Harry Ebbets stopped the bout. A left hook to the jaw had just dumped Redl for a count of nine. He barely beat the ten count. As he stood in his corner, referee Ebbets looked at him and asked, "are you all right?" The fighter replied, "Yes" but he walked out of his corner with hands down. When Fernandez rushed at him, referee Ebbets jumped between them. STANDS UNPROTECTED Redl, who lives in Passaic, N.J., was on his feet and appeared ready to resume but he didn't put his hands to protect himself as Fernandez leaped to the attack. It was the 20th straight victory for the unbeaten Fernandez and the 18th victim, who failed to go the route. This was the first time Redl has been stopped in his 28-bout pro career. All three officials had Fernandez well ahead when the end came. Judge Joe Agnello had it 6-0, judge Mike Davidowitch 4-2 and referee Ebbets 5-1. The AP card agreed with Ebbets.

Phillies Shade Cubs 8-7 Orioles Sweep Twin Bill

Towering Gene Conley, first of three Philly hurlers, notched the victory, his fourth against three defeats. Anderson was the loser, now with a 3-6 record. Philadelphia's Ed Bouchee hit a solo homer for the first of two Philly runs in the fourth.

Ernie Banks paced the Cubs 12-hit attack, driving across three runs with a first inning double and his 19th homer of the year in the sixth after Lee Walls singled.

LEADS BOTH LEAGUES

Banks now has 67 RBIs to lead both major leagues. After the Cubs nicked Conley for two runs in the first, the brave right-hander ratiocinated the Chicagoans to one hit over the next four innings.

Conley, however, was chased when the Cubs spurred for four runs on five hits in the sixth. Jack Meyer, Conley's replacement got the side out by getting pinch-hitter Jim Marshall on a pop foul.

Philadelphia's decisive run came in the seventh off Dave Hillman, fourth of five Chicago pitchers. It was unearned, due to Hillman's throwing error, trying for a force play at second base. Then rookie George Anderson
