Twix], they could've just split it. However I'm glad they didn't because that was the funniest thing I've ever seen!"

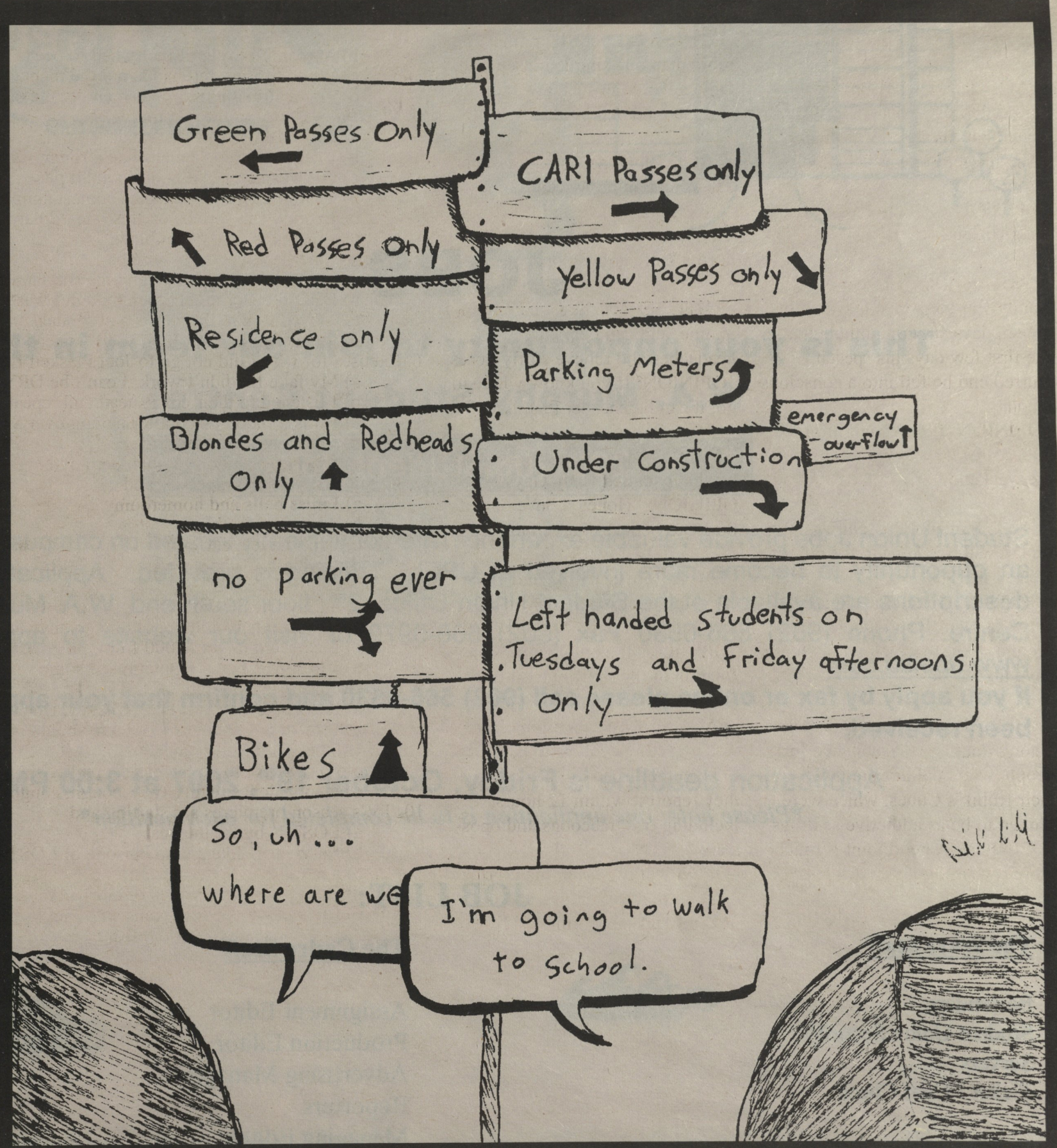
This is the fourth time an incident like this has occurred on campus since the vending machines have been installed, although so far there has been no public outcry to have the machines removed.
