I am a divorcee, also an only child, and I have a problem in regard to my mother. I was married to John, by my first marriage, in 1942. I have two children, a son and a daughter, to whom I was married in 1948. My mother divorced a second time.

Until two years ago, John was brought up almost entirely by my mother. They father and mother sent John out West to join his own father's second family.

I remarried my second husband in 1960 after he had been married for seven years. I have a young son and I live with my mother-in-law (John), interrupted by various trips abroad and stays at relatives' homes in our own city.

My father left my mother very poor financially. She has a substantial income and often speaks of what she hopes to do for her mother. My father and I have paternal grandparents far better off than Dad ever was.

My younger children and I live in an apartment just one door away from my mother's own apartment building (actually part of the same complex). This arrangement has been in effect for six months ago, I slowly drifted my mother.

This evening the children and I have just returned from an other half dinner at Mother's. She is very fond of serving in an atmosphere of such dramatic intelligence that I wonder if she can ever get over her again.
