New Information Centre Is Lighthouse At Albany

Lighthouses are always closely associated with the sea and ships. The reversal is the case of the Albany lighthouse. It is designed solely for land direction and to help visiting motorists "on course" when they move inland in this magnificent province.

Opening this afternoon

This unique tourist and information centre almost brings the motorist to a startling stop, faced as he is with an escape light-house from some distant shore. The marine theme is predominant both inside and outside, and the structure was erected by the Provincial Department of Public Works from authentic plans. It is painted white with red trimmings. The interior is of natural pine and there is a semi-circular information counter immediately on entry. The floor is of green battleship linoleum with a gold and red compass and two anchor designs in black, all to give that

naval touch. On what might be described the ceiling, hangs fishing nets and pieces of drift-wood. The stairs to the second floor has been removed outside to provide more interior space. The surrounding exterior of the building has been landscaped, and flowers and shrubbery planted. In the rear a boat, complete with mast, is bedded on a sandy beach surrounded with drift-wood. Lobster traps may be seen here and there. There is ample parking space and it is eventually planned to install a kitchen shelter and provide a picnic ground. The bureau will be manned by Walter Lord of Carleton and Miss Patricia Clark of Bedouque.

OPENS TODAY

The new bureau is to be official opened at 3 p.m. today.

Among those expected to attend are, Premier A.W. Matheson, Hon. B. Earle MacDonald, Hon. George MacKay, Frank Myers, M.L.A., Mayor W.A. Currie, Summerside, Mayor Edwin Johnston, Charlottetown, L.B. LePage, president of the Prince Edward Island Tourist Association, and A.A. Nicholson, director of the Prince Edward Island Travel Bureau.

An added feature and attraction to the opening ceremonies will be the presence of the Lads and Lassies Pipe Band under the direction of Pipe Major Wilfred Burke. These gifted performers, who are well known throughout the Maritimes, will commence their program a half hour before the main ceremony at 2.30 p.m.

The Island Travel Bureau proposes to honour the first out-of-province visitor to the new information centre by presenting a plaque as a memento.

Fishing Union Said Planned

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—Larry Daley, president of the Newfoundland Federation of Labor, said here Tuesday night the federation plans to organize a new union for the province's fishermen.

Mr. Daley said in a television appearance that the federation had launched a program to bring the fishermen into "a body that will be able to direct and control the industry."

The union, which would replace the present federation of fishermen, would provide price supports and co-operative purchasing of supplies. It would catch, cure and market the fish.

Mr. Daley said fishermen should be "organized along real union lines." He said the new union would be affiliated with Canadian Labor Congress.
