I still have \$49. left. Beaver Foods was better at our high school.

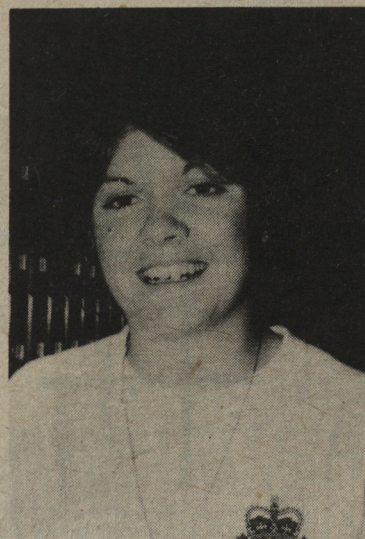


DEBBIE CALLAGHAN - Junior
Lots better than last year. It's better with two cashes.

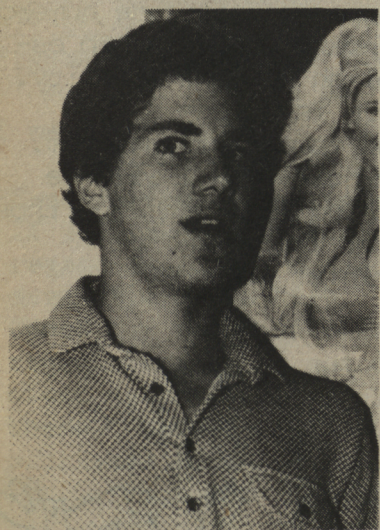


SHARMINI PERIES - Sophomore

Thursday's tomato soup was Tuesday's spaghetti.

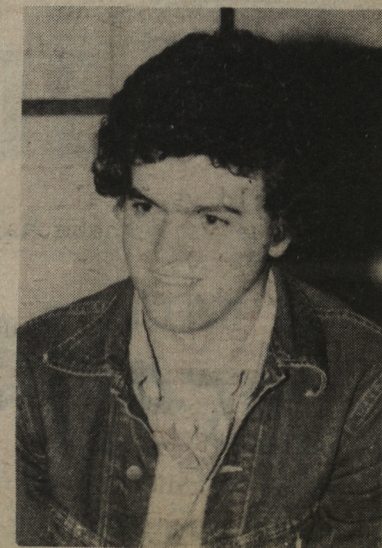


SHEILA MORRIS - Senior
