

# SPRINTS FROM THE FRONT

## MacNeill Top Driver

I TOOK a few minutes yesterday to calculate the win, place and show percentages of the drivers who have been performing regularly at the Charlottetown Driving Park this summer. I wasn't surprised to discover that Don MacNeill, formerly of Summerside and now Charlottetown, was the track's top driver at the beginning of Old Home Week.

MacNeill has made the most starts, 100, has had the most wins, 38; the most places, 22; and the most shows, 18. His driving percentage, calculated on a 5-3-1 for first-second-third starts, is a remarkable 62.5.

The second percentage driver, although he had only made 22 starts until Monday, was Robert Craig. Craig has pocketed seven wins and eight seconds in his 22 appearances here, for a good 53.2 percentage.

MacNeill and Craig are the only drivers with averages over 400 points.

Emmette Bernard, who has the second most starts at Charlottetown with his 88 has a 19-14-14 record, leading Old Home Week he just missed the 400 mark with 286. Jack Pound, Charlottetown, who has made 22 starts was fourth with 251. John Ferguson had 365.

## There's Always Horses

BUT THERE'S always the old saying: You can't win races without a horse. And MacNeill, Bernard and Craig drive the best horses on Prince Edward Island.

Take a look at the list MacNeill has to rein—Edgewood Hall, Charles and Doctor Alex. Miss Kimble, Boom, Mary Leah, Frye and Doctor Alex. I don't think I'm going out on too thin a limb by saying that this seven looks like just about the seven with the best of horses but it is anyone's guess.

But it is MacNeill who has been driving them all year long. He knows his horses, and it's very doubtful if there is anyone else in the City Park who would be as successful with the seven as MacNeill.

Emmette Bernard has commented that he has had a "poor season", but I think that 19-14-14 record looks pretty good. His stable includes Stalg Hanover, Zither, outside horses Bernard drives are W.M.X. and Windy Jane.

John's Best has been Bernard's most consistent horse. Craig has always been the pick of the track.

Craig has been working the Charlottetown track for the last few weeks I understand. He has been catch driving—working horses owned by different stables. Two of the big ones he has driven are Tennessee Billy and Sunny King. Johnny Smith and the other horses he has driven, last season. MacNeill breaks his neck or his horses all break legs. It looks like he's a good bet to walk off with the title this year.
