The Transvaal War

War Notes.

Two English clergymen are still holding services in Johannesburg.

Boer prisoners say that the Lee-Metford bullets are deficient in stopping power.

At night the Boers proper, says the Times correspondent, chant interminable psalms in Dutch, while the lawyers and shopkeepers of Pretoria sing comic or sensational English songs.

The Dannebrog states that Copenhagen business people purpose sending free 50,000 packets Danish butter as a gift for the English troops serving in South Africa. The butter will be sent to London next week.

The pigeons who have been carrying messages from Ladysmith to their lofts to Durban belong to members of the Durban Racing Pigeon Club. The distance, as the pigeon flies, is 120 miles.

Captain W. B. Lafone, of the Devons, or "Bloody Eleventh," as they are called after Salamanca, who was wounded at Elandslaagte, is a son of the member of parliament for Bermondsey.

"I think," writes a Uitlander, "it will give Tommy Atkins a bit of a turn after an action to see the boys who will be among the dead and wounded Boers. Many who look like fourteen, but are said to be sixteen, have been commandeered."

Major Meyers, of the Eton volunteers, who was killed at Nicholson's Nek, had only arrived in south Africa two days before, and it seems said irony of fate that he was elected a member of the Bachelor's Club at the last committee meeting only a week or two ago.

The Natal volunteers got their mobilization order on a Friday, and by Sunday morning every one of them had covered the thirty, sixty or eighty miles of bad and hilly road they led to the capital and, and was ready with his horse, rifle 10 rounds, blanket, etc., prepared to march.

Of the total numbers of reservists summoned to the colors 98.4 per cent rejoined, and 0.91 per cent. accounted satisfactorily for their absence, leaving 1.05 per cent. as failing to report themselves.

The hill which the British infantry stormed at Glencoe, is 1,000 feet high. The scaling of it by the Dublin Fusiliers and the King's Royal Rifles in face of the deadly fire they encountered, may safely be put down as one of the most brilliant deeds in the records of the British army.

It has transpired that the reason the complete roster of officers, non commissioned officers and men of the Canadian regiment for South Africa has not been published, is that in the hurry and excitement of departure from Quebec, after the final roll call took place, two of the captains commanding companies, pocketed both copies of their company rosters and have sailed for Cape Town with them. The department officials are awaiting return of the missing muster rolls by first mail leaving Cape Town after arrival of the Sardinian.

The Paris correspondent of the London Daily News says: "Dr. Leyds' office in Brussels is a place where more goes on than the supply of 'news.' Since the days of Panama 'chequard' editors and journalists have never rolled in such wealth as at present. I learn on what I regard as very high authority that since the beginning of the war the secret service fund of the Transvaal government in Paris alone has increased to a sum of £10,000 (\$50,000) a month. In one case, at least, a paper draws a larger amount from the sale of its whole issue. This paper is known in the Paris journalistic world to be always open to sale to the highest bidder."

It is interesting to read what Lord Wolseley has said in his Soldiers' Pocket Book, under the head of "Advice to Officers on Service as Regards Their Bearing Toward Their Men." He says: "In action, to be cool and to seem ignorant that any danger exists, is of the first consequence. You must, at the same time, however, evince a lively interest in all that is going on; come what may, have a smiling face. If your men are under a fire to which they are replying, walk about in front of them as they are lying down. I do not mean that you never to avail yourself of cover, for when skirmishing it is your duty to do so, but under the above-mentioned circumstances the best troops are prone to become unsteady, and it is then the especial duty of the officers to show an example of coolness and steadiness. When wounded, the officers should take a pride in refusing the assistance of the men to take them to the rear, etc."

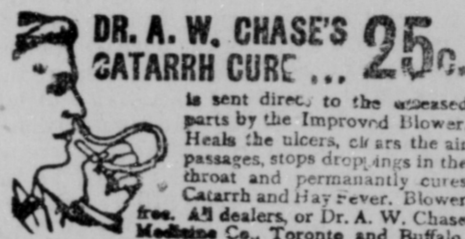
