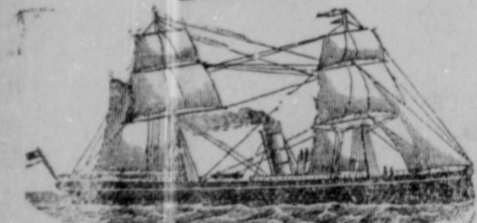

The Care of the Eyes.

On arising in the morning the eyes should be bathed gently in cold water—twenty "passes" are said to be decidedly strengthening. While using them closely they should be rested at intervals of an hour or two, for the strain of constant reading or sewing is like that of extending the arms at a certain height immovable. Imagine, then, the taxing of the eyes, which cannot complain save after years of irreparable neglect. When dust settles in the eyes warm water will soothe them from any inflammation; rose-water is extremely refreshing, but it should be bought in small quantities, as it keeps but a short time. Five cents' worth will give a daily eye bath for several weeks. Tealeaves and alum-water were the eye tonics which our grandfathers used; but in these modern days of absolute hygienic and antiseptic simplicity, water especially in a distilled form, is considered powerful enough.—Harper's Bazar.

Moths.

One of the best and easiest ways to suppress moths is to burn sulphur in their haunts. Closets and apartments may be treated in this way, one by one in order not to have too heavy a dose of the fumes at one time. Delicate fabrics and garments trimmed with any sort of metal trimmings should be taken from closets and gilt framed pictures and silver and gilt bric-a-brac removed from rooms before the sulphur is used. It has been known to change the color of a paper which has a heavy gilt pattern. With these exceptions however it is harmless. A piece of lump sulphur is put in any sort of metal can or vessel, a little excelsior being placed beneath it to start it burning. The room or closet in which it is burned is carefully shut for a few hours. Rugs, furs and blankets in use in a house that seems peculiarly infested with moths—for they appear in large numbers every spring—have been kept absolutely free from injury by this semi-annual treatment of the closets in which they are packed away.

Haggis as the Scotch Make it

To make haggis, take the heart, tongue and a small liver of the sheep, one pound of bacon, four ounces of crumb of bread, the rind of one lemon, two eggs, two anchovies (sardines may be used), a quarter of a teaspoonful of pepper and two teaspoonfuls of salt. Chop the heart, tongue, liver and bacon; mix thoroughly; add the bread crumbed, the anchovies chopped fine, the lemon rind grated, then the pepper and salt. Beat the eggs and pour them over. Pack this into a kettle or mould cover and boil or steam continuously for two hours. Turn it on a dish and serve very hot.—August Ladies Home Journal.

Sift together one pint of flour, one tablespoonful of sugar, a very little salt

and one teaspoonful of baking powder. Mix with five well-beaten eggs, one cup of milk one-quarter of a cup of melted butter and two cups mashed raspberries. Bake and serve with a sauce made of one cup of berries mashed with three tablespoonfuls of sugar; rub them through a sieve, add one cup of water, a little salt, one tablespoonful of butter and one tablespoonful of cornstarch dissolved in a little cold water. Let boil for five minutes.

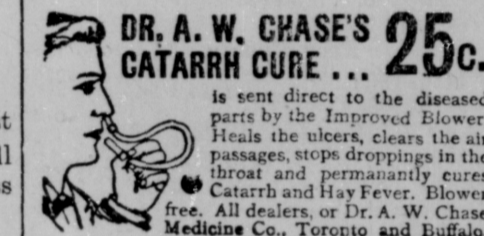

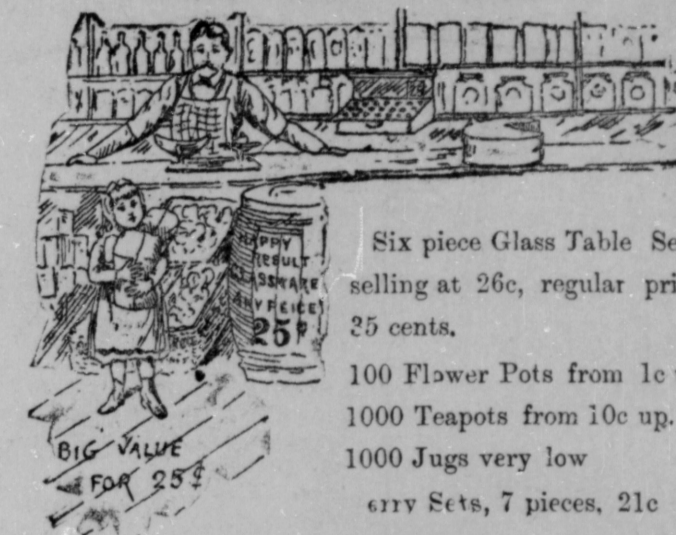

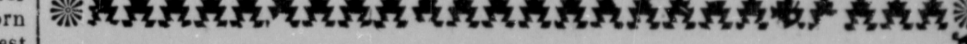
