Dulles Says New Plan Would Bar World War III

By WARREN ROGERS JR. WASHINGTON (AP) — State Secretary Dulles testified Monday Congress will have done less than its utmost for peace and freedom if it fails to approve President Eisenhower's Middle East manifesto.

Dulles, who testified at both morning and afternoon sessions, said it would be a major disaster for the Communists to capture the Middle East.

Dulles described what he said are three perils from communism in the Middle East: outright armed attack, subversion and takeover-by-allure.

The secretary appeared before a hearing of the 32-member House of Representatives foreign affairs committee to start congressional consideration of a proposed resolution he said would: 1. 'Make unmistakably clear' to Russia and the world the United States is determined to help Middle East nations stay free.
