PRINCESS BUSY WITH HER BROOD

ROME, Aug. 31-(CP)—Princess Yolanda, 38-year-old daughter of King-Emperor Vittorio Emanuele and Queen-Empress Elena, who, 16 years ago, fell in love and married a commoner in a story-book romance, now lives a simple life in Tripoli. The Princess is the wife of Count Ghego Carl Calvi do Bergoglio, a cavalry officer in the Italian army, in command of the Libyan cavalry in Italy's African colony. The name of the Princess who married the handsome young cavalry captain who taught her to ride now rarely appears in Italy's newspapers unless to mention her attendance at races. Most of her time is spent in mothering her four children - grandchildren of the King-Emperor - and in keeping house. While not of royal blood the count comes from an old Italian family. He entered the military school at Modena at 19, and 1908 was commissioned a second lieutenant, and assigned to one of Italy's crack cavalry regiments. After emerging as a captain with one silver and three bronze medals for valor from the Great War, he became an instructor in the famous training school at Pinerolo, and it was there he met Princess Yolanda.

EDMONTON, Aug. 30-(CP)—Famous bad lands of the Red River Valley, long regarded as the richest dinosaur graveyard in the Dominion, have been established as a provincial park, under terms of an order-in-council passed by the Alberta Government, it was announced today.
