City, N.J., with a \$1,000 bill taped to her leg. The gimmick: The money was held in place by Texcel cellophane tape, whose makers footed the bill for the stunt. Reporters arrived to find that the swank presidential suite of the Statler Hotel—where Roosevelt, Truman, Eisenhower and MacArthur have stayed—had been turned into a temporary pigeon loft. The surroundings failed to impress the pigeons. Several, in small cardboard boxes in the big room, were muttering to each other.

Fluttering anxiously from coop to box were two men identified as William Indyk, who owned the birds, and Otto Meyer of Fair Haven, N.J., who used to be a pigeon expert for the armed services. "We figure," Indyk said, "that it will take from 4 1/2 to five hours for the pigeons to reach home. It's exactly 198,023 miles from here."

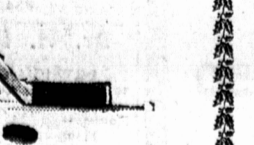
