SHIPS ESCORTED 12 MILES OUT

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—The fisheries patrol vessel Cape Freels escorted six Russian fishing boats to a 12-mile limit outside the declared Canadian 12-mile fishing zone, it was learned here Thursday.

The Russian ships, six trawlers and a factory ship, were escorted in fish-landing operations about four miles off Cape St. Francis on the southeastern coast of Newfoundland when the season ends, probably today.

The Russian fleet was told of the enlarged fishing zone and moved outside the 12-mile limit. The Russian vessels were not ordered to leave to the Cape Freels informed them of the new limit by loudspeaker. The instructions were given in English.

Riding Loses Representation

QUEBEC (CP)—The riding of Trois-Rivieres has started another period of going without representation in the Quebec legislature as a result of the suspension of Yves Gabias.

U Thant Appeals To Soviet Union

MOSCOW (Reuters) - United Nations Secretary-General U Thant appealed to the Soviet Union Thursday to help save the UN from a serious financial crisis.

Thant made his plea on Soviet television after telling a Moscow press conference he found Premier Khrushchev adamant in refusing to pay for UN peace-keeping operations in the Congo and Middle East.

The secretary general declared that he believed Soviet leaders will accept a year or so search for a solution, so that the United Nations will not face the same fate as its predecessor, the League of Nations.

WASHINGTON (AP) - U.S. Senators investigating juvenile delinquency showed a sharp less Thursday of what one of them called "brutal violence" in television programs. Ten broadcasters were told:
