SMALLPOX VACCINATING CLINICS. —During the past week re-vaccinating clinics were held in the four Public Schools, also Parkdale, Spring Park and Notre Dame Academy. The programme was carried out by Dr. O. H. Curtis, Chief Health Officer, and Miss Bessie Beer, Public Health nurse for the Charlottetown area. A total of 574 pupils from grades 8-10 were given this application. The response to the recommended procedure of being re-vaccinated every 5-7 years was excellent, and in many classrooms 100% of the students were done. It is required that all pupils be protected before entering school, but some years have elapsed since re-vaccination has been offered. That this was needed has been demonstrated by the number of "takes" which have occurred. Smallpox vaccinations have also been completed recently in 184 schools in Queen's County when 2872 school and pre-school children attended the clinics.
