New York Stock Market Trend Continues Bullish

NEW YORK, Aug. 3 - (AP) - The stock market last week ended three straight bull market months and started on a fourth. The rise last week was moderate, and there was an almost complete lack of speculative demand. At the end of the week the Associated Press average of 60 stocks stood at \$109.20, a new 1952 high and the best level for the average since June 10, 1930.

Settlement of the steel strike gave the industry new high prices. That is inflationary. Government officials warned of higher prices to come all along the line. And stocks respond to the stimulation of inflation. Packard motor car was the week's most active issue on the big board with 100,300 shares traded. It closed up 1/4 at 5 1/2. It was followed by American Bosch up 1/2 at 14 1/2, U.S. Steel up 1 at 41 1/2, Southern Railway up 5/8 at 67 1/2, and American Machinery up 2 1/2 at 21 1/2.

On the curb exchange, Devon Leduc oils was the most heavily traded issue of the week up 1 1/2 at 3 1/2 with 80,000 shares changing hands. It was followed by Pan-coastal Oil unchanged at 3 1/2, new British Dominion Oils up 1/4 at 3 1/2, Barium Steel up 1/4 at 9 1/2, and North Canadian Oils unchanged at 2. Canadian issues were higher Friday. Dome Mines was up 1/2. McIntyre added 1/2. Canadian Pacific gained 1/4 and Distillers Seagram was up 1/4. Hiram Walker and International Nickel were both unquoted.

On the curb, Lake Shore and Giant Yellowknife were unquoted and Royallite Oil added 1/4.

U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, O., Aug. 3 - (AP) - It will take the steel industry at least three more weeks to shrug off effects of the recent strikes and regain full production schedules. Steel magazine says today. The metal-working weekly says speed of recovery depends on the extent of needed repairs to steel facilities.

The national ingot rate rose 3 1/2 points last week to 47 per cent of capacity. An even more rapid rate of recovery was prevented by localized disputes in separate union agreements. Steel also predicts intermittent shutdowns and curtailments over the next four or five months for lack of balanced steel and component supplies. Civilian goods manufacturing, Steel added, will bear the brunt of the shortages.

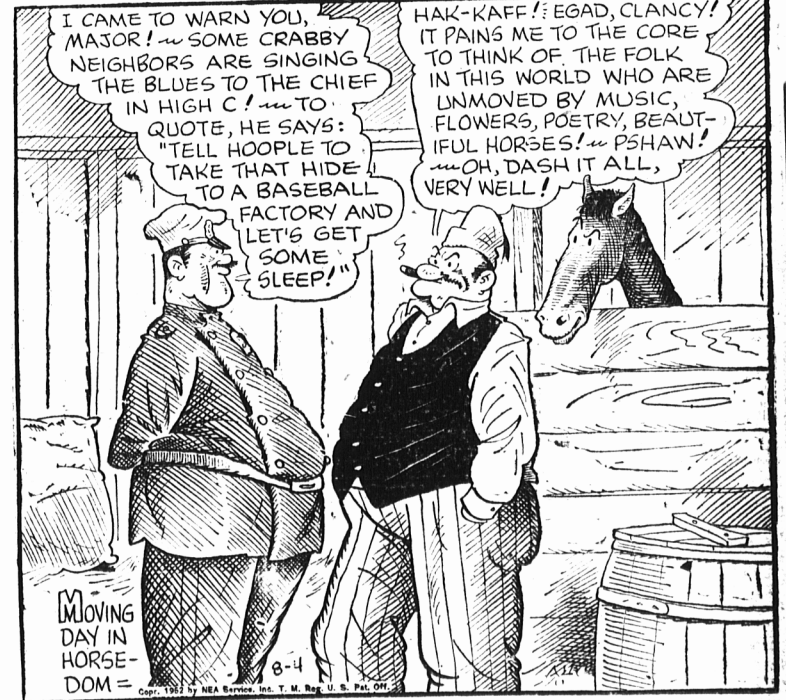
