

Commission Rejects Moore-Olson Match

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The California Athletic Commission Wednesday rejected a proposed fight between champion light heavyweight Archie Moore and Bobo Olson, former middleweight king.

The commission took action after pointing out Olson had not met any ranking 175-pounders although the National Boxing Association lists him as the eighth ranked challenger.

The motion was passed without objection.

Commission chairman Dan O. Flory read into the record protests from the Pennsylvania commission against an Olson-Moore fight. Pennsylvania argued that Arnold Johnson of Philadelphia could get a prior title shot or at Olson should fight Johnson before meeting Moore.

OLSON CHALLENGE
The Johnson camp challenged Olson "at 10 or 12 rounds anywhere in the United States."

Olson's new manager, Bill Newman, asked the commission to sanction a championship bout early next year. He pointed out that since coming out of retirement the 39 year old Olson has won five bouts. However, the only "name" boxer he has beaten is Rory Calhoun, former lead-

Calgary Stamps Hired Coaches

CALGARY (CP) — Calgary campers announced Wednesday they have rehired assistant coaches Frank Filchok and Berne Witucki for another season. The announcement came two days after the club signed head coach Otis Douglas for another year.

Filchok, completing his first year in Calgary as backfield coach, is a former head coach of the Edmonton Eskimos and Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Western Interprovincial Football Union and Sarnia Golden Bears of the Ontario Rugby Football Union.

Witucki came to the Stamps last spring as line coach from an assistant's post at Notre Dame. Previously he was head coach at the University of Tulsa.

Sugar Ray Works Out

NEW YORK (AP) — Sugar Ray Robinson worked out in the gym Wednesday for the third straight day in preparation for defence of a share of the world middleweight boxing title.

The 39-year-old New Yorker, who meets Paul Pender in a title bout at Boston Dec. 14, plans to start boxing next Monday. Robinson is recognized as champion in New York and Massachusetts. The National Boxing Association recognizes Gene Fullmer as king of the 160-pounders.

Harris Fans 18 Out Loses Tilt

MARACAIBO (AP) — Bill Harris struck out 13 in a Venezuelan Eastern League baseball game Tuesday night, but his Cabimas team was beaten by Gavilanes.

The only run off Harris, a right-hander on Los Angeles Dodgers' roster, scored on an error. Harris, a native of Dugwayville, N.B., Harris gave up seven hits while pitcher Billy Muffett, formerly of St. Louis and San Francisco, allowed only five.

Cepeda Is Voted 1959 Sophomore

NEW YORK (AP) — Orlando Cepeda of San Francisco Giants, the National League's rookie of the year in 1958, Wednesday was named the circuit's leading sophomore of 1959. He edged Vada Pinson of Cincinnati in the annual Associated Press poll.

Cepeda collected 86 of the 172 votes cast by members of the Baseball Writers' Association of America. Pinson drew 66. Cepeda, 22, a native of Puerto Rico, batted .317 with 27 homers and 105 runs batted in. This was better performance than his rookie campaign, when he wound up with a .312 average, 25 homers and 96 RBI.

Prince Aly Khan Is Top Winner

PARIS (AP) — Prince Aly Khan led the list of top money-winning owners for the 1959 flat horse racing season in France with \$226,000. His horses also won more than twice as many races as the runner-up, taking the prince's colors to the winner's circle 51 times.

Madame Cino del Luca was second, with her horses accounting for \$171,155 and 20 victories.

A few weeks remain in the French season, but the prince's winnings are well beyond reach. He also set a money record for owners on British tracks this season.

L.A. Applies For Franchise

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Los Angeles baseball interests have applied for a franchise in baseball's proposed new Continental League it was revealed Wednesday.

A group of TV people headed by Stanley Brown, retired distillery president, are behind the new club.

Brown said the group has an option on a franchise in the new league. He is due to continue negotiating in New York Saturday with Branch Rickey Sr., president of the new league.

Pinson Made Good in Second Major League Try

Pinson made good in his second major league try. He compiled a .316 batting mark, collecting 295 hits, 20 homers and 84 RBI. He led the league in doubles with 47 and runs scored, 131.

The 21-year-old infielder from Memphis was a much-heralded rookie in spring training of 1958. But after playing in 18 games for the Reds, during which he hit only .194, Pinson was demoted to Seattle of the Pacific Coast League. He had a .343 percentage with Seattle and returned to Cincinnati in September, finishing with a National League average of .271.
