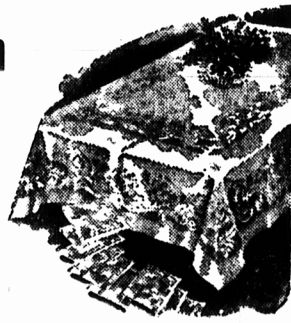

cede two clubs tricks. Down one! South had to go out of his way to lose the contract. At least two better lines of play were readily available. One was to begin immediately on the establishment of the diamond suit. True, West could ruff a third round, but it would cost him his natural trump trick.

Another winning plan, based on declarer's actual sequence of plays up to the sixth trick, was to refuse to ruff the third heart lead. All South had to do was discard a low club on this trick, and the defenders would have been helpless.
