

Shipbuilding Co. Asks Extra Payments For Ship

OTTAWA (CP)—Davis Shipbuilding Company of Lauzon, Que., is demanding extra payments totalling \$1,088,919 on top of the \$15,282,994 price of the naval supply ship Provider, Defence Production Minister Drury disclosed Monday.

In a Commons return for Douglas Fisher (NDP—Port Arthur) Mr. Drury said the company's claim it did work not covered by the contract is being investigated.

Earlier, Associate Defence Minister Cardin said the gov-

ernment has made a claim against Davis under the warranty clause of the contract.

Mr. Drury said following acceptance of the ship by the navy, defects appeared in some of the vessel's winch pumps and motors. The "great part" of the re-company's sub-contractor at the sub-contractor's expense.

Some "partial remedial work" had been done at the Halifax dockyard and a claim against Davis Shipbuilding was being prepared. The amount had not

yet been established.

DAVE FILING CLAIMS

Meanwhile, Dave is filing three claims against the government: \$835,250 for alleged extra work; \$20,000 for an as of parts; and \$80,000 for an unspecified reason.

However, the final contract price was \$15,282,994.

Mr. Drury said all original tenders by six companies were subject to sales tax being extra.
