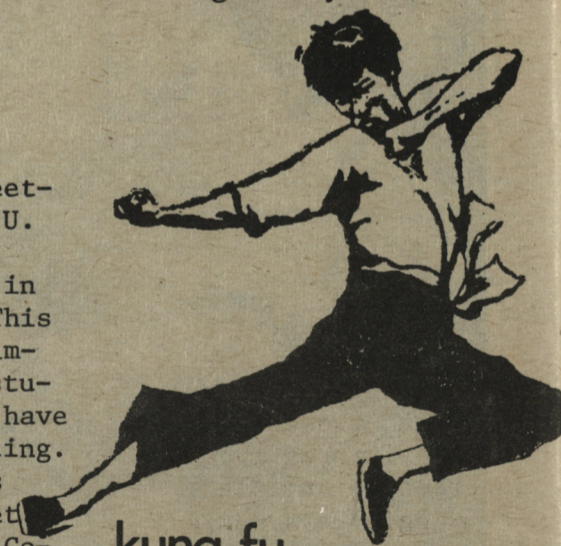
STUDENT SERVICES
