Wiking Ruins in Newfoundland

Discovery in Newfoundland of the remains of a thousand-year-old Norse settlement offers a solution to an old historical puzzle: Did Vikings visit North America some 500 years before Columbus' voyage?

Dr. Ingstad's findings are a strongly supported by Dr. Junius Bird, Curator of Archeology at the American Museum of Natural History and Henry Collins, a Smithsonian Institution anthropologist.

Dr. Ingstad said the site near L'Anse aux Meadows, a small fishing village at the northern tip of the island of Newfoundland, closely fits the description of Ericson's settlement in Iceland sagas.
