Color Split Discounted By Commonwealth Official

By JOSEPH MacSWEIN LONDON (CP) - An official Commonwealth secretary-general, has discounted reports of a sharp split along color lines in the multi-national family over the timing of the next conference of Commonwealth prime ministers.

The Canadian diplomat addressed the Commonwealth Correspondents' Association before convening at his Marlborough

House headquarters a meeting of high commissioners and deputies to discuss the date of the summit conference.

Smith gave no rundown on how various countries have reacted to Britain's request for a postponement to September of the planned July conference on Rhodesia. It was learned, however, that at least 14 of the 23 Commonwealth members have replied.

The best speculation appeared to be that a considerable number do not object to a September date provided sister Commonwealth nations are willing to meet them. On balance at present, a September meeting as opposed to July appeared likely despite bitter disagreement by Zambia's President Kenneth Kaunda and some other African leaders.

Prime Minister Pearson has not put Canada's position on the record yet. The background seems to be that Canada is not taking an adamant stand either way. If the others want July, that would be agreeable to Canada. But one stipulation is that if September is selected, it would be in the first half of the month.

Following the Tuesday meeting the Commonwealth secretary-general issued a statement saying that he had been in touch with Commonwealth heads of government on the summit question.

For fuller consultation and exchange of views he had called in Britain's Sir Saville Garner, undersecretary in the Commonwealth relations office, Canada's Lionel Chevrier and other high commissioners.

The statement gave no details but unofficial sources said the high commissioners recommended the September meeting should be a full-scale conference, discussing other matters besides Rhodesia.

Strong views had been heard from Zambia in favor of a July meeting but for the most part these were simply "noted" by other countries.

Reminded of his January statement in Lagos that the Rhodesian situation had developed into a case of the Commonwealth against Ian Smith, Rhodesian premier, the secretary-general was asked whether there now is the same enthusiasm for toppling the rebel premier's white minority regime which seized independence from Britain last year.
