# Financial Aid

Should you be thinking about part-time, summer or permanent employment, you should consider registering with the Canada Employment Centre on Campus. Registration is voluntary, but unless you register we have no way of contacting you. We are located in the Main Building adjacent to Student Services.

There will be an Information Session on recruitment for the Canadian Armed Forces by Captain Currie. This session will take place in Main 01 on Tuesday, February 5th, 1985.

A booklet describing Federal Summer Employment Opportunities and application forms are also available. It is recommended that a separate application form be completed for each position you are interested in. Positions include Visitor Services Attendant, Sector Supervisor, Student Placement Officer, Park Warden, Park Labourer, Park Janitor, Beach Captain, Surfguard and Waterfront Guard, Green Gables Interpretive Guide, Historic Park Guide, Inshore Rescue, and Casual Farm Labourer.

It should be noted that some of these jobs are not designated for students only, even though students may be hired to fill them. Applications should be received by January 31, 1985.

A series of information seminars on various aspects of the job hunt will be held again this semester. Individual assistance with your job hunt can also be arranged by appointment. Presently I am planning on holding sessions on January 24th and 31st and February 7th and 14th. Topics will include, respectively, The Job Interview; Getting Organized (letters of application, employer contacts, being prepared); Traditional and Non-Traditional Approaches; and Tying It All Together (what, where, and how do I get the best job for me?). It will be in Room 01 of the Main Building at 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on the above dates.

For interested graduates, the following positions may be of interest:

— Maritime Life is currently recruiting for the 1985 actuarial program (permanent and summer). An Actuarial Aptitude Battery is scheduled for Friday, February 8th at 2:00 p.m. in Room 01, Main Building. Please advise our office if you are interested so we can forward your application.

— The Correctional Service of Canada is interested in recruiting university graduates from the social sciences who possess a high level of inter-personal skills, have demonstrated an interest in the helping professions, and who are mature and reliable.

Incumbents will perform regular security functions as well as contribute to institutional social support systems. Further information

## English conference starts

The Fifth Annual Undergraduate English Conference will be hosted by the University of Prince Edward Island on Friday and Saturday, January 25 and 26, 1985.

Registration will take place in the Main Building from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. January 25. The fee, which covers admission to all conference events, is \$10 for those who pre-register by mail before January 14, and \$20 thereafter.

Two concurrent programs consisting of six sessions each are scheduled for January 26. Papers in previous years have been those written for regular classes. No more than 30 minutes should be spent reading, with the remainder of the session reserved for discussion.

A poetry reading entertainment will be scheduled for Friday evening, to be followed by a wine and cheese reception. Lunch will be provided on Saturday, with re-

freshments available between sessions. Preparations are currently being made to feature a guest speaker at the banquet, which is to be held Saturday evening.

This invitation is extended to all interested persons.

Those UPEI students interested in attending any or all of the conference events are asked to register their names with the English Department Secretary, or contact the head of the Department of English.



Several bursaries are available for the second semester through the UPEI Memorial Bursary Fund:

— Bernardine Hall-Residence Bursary: A \$500 award is offered to a Junior or Senior female student living in Bernardine Hall who has lived there for at least two years. She must have a 70% average or better last semester and must write an essay describing how she has participated in residence life at Bernardine.

— Part-time Student Bursary: This is the first year for this \$150 award. The award is offered to part-time students in need of financial assistance.

— UPEI Memorial Award: Several awards ranging from \$125 to \$300 are available to full-time students for second semester. One of the major criteria in choice of award recipients is need for financial assistance.

Applications may be picked up in the Registrar's Office or in the Department of Student Services. Completed applications should be returned by February 8, 1985.

### TOURISM SCHOLARSHIP

This award is sponsored by the Tourism Industry Association of PEI. The \$1000 scholarship is offered to students 17 to 25 years of age who hope to pursue a career in the hospitality industry. Students must maintain an average of 70% and make every attempt to find employment in the hospitality industry in the summer months.

### CIDA

This award is made to a student pursuing post graduate studies related to the field of International Development and Cooperation. The academic program must include a substantial period of field work in one or more developing countries. The amount of the award ranges up to \$15,000/yr. The deadline for receipt of applications is January 31.

## UPEI Memorial Bursary

Several awards are available for second semester to full-time students in any year of study. Awards range in amount from \$125 to \$300. One of the major criteria considered in awarding the bursaries is financial need.
