

# Hebenton Goes To Bruins In Internal Draft Tues.

**Montreal (CP)**—Cautious Montreal Hockey League officials devoted lightly into each other's ranks Wednesday and plucked only a few players from the ice circuit's internal draft, the first to be held in several years.

Detroit Red Wings picked up three of the six, two were taken by Boston Bruins and one by New York Rangers.

Cop winners, Chicago Black Hawks and Montreal Canadiens passed an every turn, and expectations that veteran defenseman Doug Harvey would fetch a high price were left unprotected by the New York club.

One of the better-known among the six who move to another club was Andy Hebenton, 23-year-old right winger who hasn't missed a game with the Lady Byng award in 1958 as most gentlemanly and accomplished player.

Hebenton was drafted by Boston Bruins who also took 21-year-old center Wayne Rivers, Detroit-owned player, last season with Hershey of the American League.

**SPEND \$10,000**  
 At the \$20,000 draft price, Detroit piled up an outlay of \$140,000 for new talent, including four players acquired Tuesday in the draft from the minor leagues.

The three picked by Detroit in Wednesday's inter-league draft were:

- From Boston, Irvin Spencer, forward - defenceman who scored five goals and 17 assists with the Bruins last season.
- From New York, Ted Hampson, 27, centre, whose output last season was only four goals and two assists in 46 games.
- From Chicago, Art Stratton, centre forward, who tallied with Buffalo of the AHL last season and amassed 20 goals and 71 assists.

In the draft process, Val Fonteyne was removed from the protected list by Detroit Wings and was promptly grabbed by

The report got around that Doug Harvey's salary—said to be \$30,000 with the Rangers—was too much for the other clubs to take on, plus the \$20,000 draft price. There was also his age—30.

Following the draft, Detroit announced it had turned over to Chicago Black Hawks defenceman Howie Young, long a problem performer with the Red Wings, in completion of a deal carried out Tuesday. Wings got defenceman Ron Ingram and rookie goalie Roger Crozier, with St. Louis of the Eastern Professional League.

There was speculation that Young will be turned over to Buffalo of the AHL.

President Al Leader of the Western League announced that Spokane Comets had given up their franchise and that it would go to Denver.

Toronto Maple Leafs said they had purchased the Spokane club on behalf of a group of Denver business men and that the Leafs will supply players and coach—none of them named.
