Senate Clashes Explosively
Over Satellite Legislation

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senator Wayne Morse (Dem. Ore.) challenged the majority of the Senate's two top Democrats and rejected their leadership Tuesday in an explosive clash over the U.S. administration's communications satellite bill.

Targets of his outburst were Senator Mike Mansfield of Montana, the majority leader, and Senator Robert F. Humphrey of Minnesota, party whip.

He also took sharp issue with Humphrey's comment that threats to reelection of senators in congressional elections unless action is speeded up on the stalled legislation.

Morse insisted Humphrey "took the crack" opponents of the satellite communications bill and suggested they were in trouble at the polls in November.

FOUGHT BACK
Mansfield fought back throughout the stormy exchange. He accused Morse and his associates who are filibustering against the bill of " tactics that are delaying and dilatory."
